Associations of "Pathology" (30 Words)

anatomical	An expression that relates to anatomy. <i>Anatomical research.</i>
<u>anatomy</u>	A person’s body. <i>Every part of his anatomy hurt.</i>
autopsy	Perform an autopsy on a body or organ. <i>On autopsy it was established that he had suffered from a rare brain condition.</i>
<u>cadaver</u>	The dead body of a human being. <i>The cadaver was intended for dissection.</i>
clinical	Relating to the observation and treatment of actual patients rather than theoretical or laboratory studies. <i>Clinical medicine.</i>
corpse	Spoil a piece of acting by forgetting one’s lines or laughing uncontrollably. <i>One singer ad libbed and corpsed his colleagues on stage.</i>
cosmetic	Serving an esthetic rather than a useful purpose. <i>The reform package was merely a cosmetic exercise.</i>
dermatology	The branch of medicine dealing with the skin and its diseases.
dissection	A minute and critical analysis. <i>This dissection of modern relationships.</i>
doctor	Remove the sexual organs of (an animal) so that it cannot reproduce. <i>The reports could have been doctored.</i>
ear	Good hearing. <i>She offers a sympathetic ear to worried pet owners.</i>
gynecology	The branch of medicine that deals with the diseases and hygiene of women.

hospital	A charitable institution for the education of the young. <i>Christ's Hospital.</i>
medical	Relating to the study or practice of medicine. <i>He was transferred for further treatment to a medical ward.</i>
medicine	Medicine something that treats or prevents or alleviates the symptoms of disease. <i>Fleur was murdering him by use of bad medicine.</i>
microbiology	The branch of biology that studies microorganisms and their effects on humans.
morgue	A newspaper's collection of miscellaneous information for use in future obituaries. <i>The cadavers were bagged and removed to the city morgue.</i>
morphological	Relating to or concerned with the morphology of plants and animals. <i>The geraniums have a number of unusual morphological adaptations.</i>
<u>morphology</u>	The branch of biology that deals with the form of living organisms, and with relationships between their structures. <i>Grammar is organized along two main dimensions morphology and syntax.</i>
neurology	Neurology the branch of medicine that deals with the nervous system and its disorders.
<u>nose</u>	A front that resembles a human nose especially the front of an aircraft. <i>She wanted a good nose round the house.</i>
ophthalmology	The branch of medicine concerned with the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye.
otolaryngology	The study of diseases of the ear and throat.
<u>physiological</u>	Relating to the branch of biology that deals with the normal functions of living organisms and their parts. <i>Slow down your body's physiological response to anger by breathing deeply.</i>
physiology	The branch of the biological sciences dealing with the functioning of organisms. <i>The physiology of the brain.</i>
psychiatry	The branch of medicine dealing with the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders.
surgical	Done with great precision, especially with reference to a swift and highly accurate military attack from the air. <i>Surgical stockings.</i>

therapy The treatment of mental or psychological disorders by psychological means.

*The **therapy** helps the patient to deal with difficult relationships.*

treatment Care provided to improve a situation (especially medical procedures or applications that are intended to relieve illness or injury).

*The **treatment** of water sewage.*

vivisection The practice of performing operations on live animals for the purpose of experimentation or scientific research (used only by opponents of such work).

*The abolition of **vivisection**.*
