esplanade	<p>A long stretch of open level ground (paved or grassy) for walking beside the seashore.</p>
expedient	<p>A means of attaining an end, especially one that is convenient but possibly improper or immoral.</p> <p><i>The current policy is a political expedient.</i></p>
fashion	<p>The latest and most admired style in clothes and cosmetics and behavior.</p> <p><i>The latest Parisian fashions.</i></p>
footpath	<p>A path for people to walk along, especially a right of way in the countryside.</p>
<u>instrument</u>	<p>The semantic role of the entity (usually inanimate) that the agent uses to perform an action or start a process.</p> <p><i>A percussion instrument.</i></p>
jogging track	<p>Running at a jog trot as a form of cardiopulmonary exercise.</p>
lane	<p>An urban street.</p> <p><i>DNA from various sources is placed in separate lanes on an electrophoretic gel.</i></p>
manner	<p>The way a motor vehicle handles or performs.</p> <p><i>Taking notes in an unobtrusive manner.</i></p>
measure	<p>Measuring instrument having a sequence of marks at regular intervals used as a reference in making measurements.</p> <p><i>Now tread we a measure.</i></p>
<u>mechanism</u>	<p>A natural or established process by which something takes place or is brought about.</p> <p><i>The mechanism of the ear.</i></p>
<u>medium</u>	<p>A means or instrumentality for storing or communicating information.</p> <p><i>Oil paint is the most popular medium for glazing.</i></p>
method	<p>An acting technique introduced by Stanislavsky in which the actor recalls emotions or reactions from his or her own life and uses them to identify with the character being portrayed.</p> <p><i>Historical study is the rigorous combination of knowledge and method.</i></p>
<u>mode</u>	<p>A set of musical notes forming a scale and from which melodies and harmonies are constructed.</p> <p><i>His preferred mode of travel was a kayak.</i></p>

nerve pathway	Any bundle of nerve fibers running to various organs and tissues of the body.
nerve tract	The courage to carry on.
<u>passage</u>	A narrow way allowing access between buildings or to different rooms within a building a passageway. <i>He picked up the newspaper and read the passage again.</i>
passageway	A passage between rooms or between buildings. <i>Her hotel was at the end of a narrow passageway off the main street.</i>
procedure	A surgical operation. <i>The standard procedure for informing new employees about conditions of work.</i>
process	A mental process that you are not directly aware of. <i>A bony process.</i>
promenade	A public area set aside as a pedestrian walk. <i>An evening promenade.</i>
<u>ride</u>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. <i>Investors have had a bumpy ride.</i>
riding	The sport or activity of riding horses. <i>Riding is an exhilarating experience.</i>
right of way	The interest possessed by law or custom in some intangible thing.
sidetrack	A railway branch line or siding. <i>A sidetrack to the original discovery well.</i>
technique	A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure. <i>He has excellent technique.</i>
towpath	A path beside a river or canal, originally used as a pathway for horses towing barges.
track	The sport of running on a track. <i>The track of an animal.</i>

axon	The long threadlike part of a nerve cell along which impulses are conducted from the cell body to other cells.
boldness	The trait of being willing to undertake things that involve risk or danger. <i>You will overlook my boldness I hope.</i>
cerebellum	A major division of the vertebrate brain; situated above the medulla oblongata and beneath the cerebrum in humans.
corpuscle	(nontechnical usage) a tiny piece of anything. <i>These subparticles at the centre of an antimony corpuscle are fluid and volatile.</i>

<u>muscular</u>	Having a robust muscular body build characterized by predominance of structures bone and muscle and connective tissue developed from the embryonic mesodermal layer. <i>Energy is needed for muscular activity.</i>
<u>nerve</u>	Any bundle of nerve fibers running to various organs and tissues of the body. <i>His first night nerves soon disappeared.</i>
neural	Relating to a nerve or the nervous system. <i>Patterns of neural activity.</i>
neurobiologist	A specialist in neurobiology.
neuron	A cell that is specialized to conduct nerve impulses.
neuroscientist	A neurobiologist who specializes in the study of the brain. <i>There is a significant and growing need among neuroscientists to exchange experimental data.</i>
neurotically	In a neurotic manner.
olfactory	Relating to the sense of smell. <i>The olfactory organs.</i>
palsy	Affect with palsy. <i>Is the calmness of philosophy or the palsy of insensibility to be looked for.</i>
paralysis	Loss of the ability to move a body part. <i>The fast acting venom causes paralysis breathing difficulties and sometimes death.</i>

parietal	A parietal structure. <i>Parietal lobe.</i>
receptiveness	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>He was testing the government s receptiveness to reform.</i>
<u>sensory</u>	Relating to or concerned in sensation. <i>Sensory channels.</i>
synapse	The junction between two neurons (axon-to-dendrite) or between a neuron and a muscle. <i>Nerve impulses cross a synapse through the action of neurotransmitters.</i>
<u>tract</u>	An area of land, typically a large one. <i>It took courage to privatize vast tracts of nationalized industry.</i>
