According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “patriot” as a noun can have the following definitions:

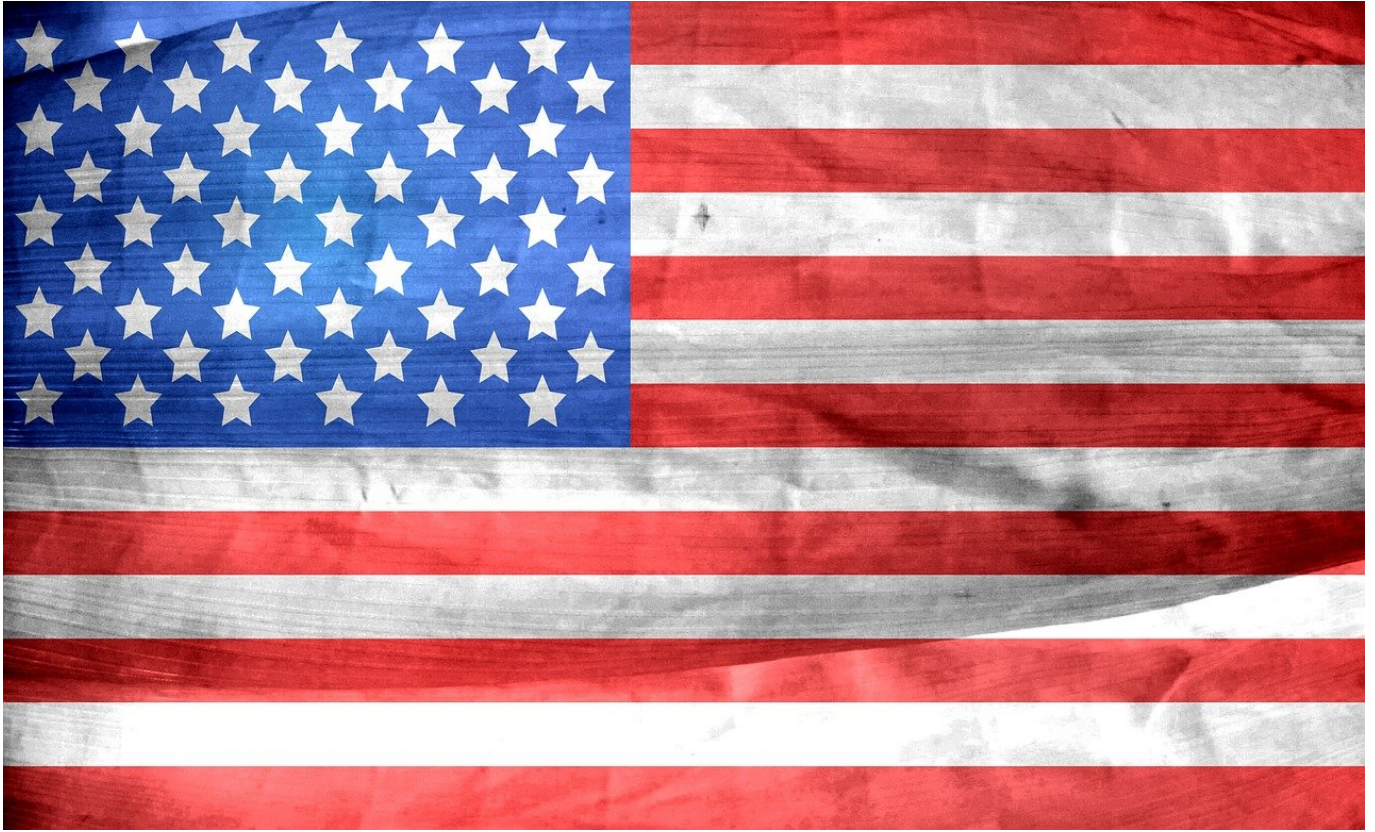
- *An automated surface-to-air missile designed for early detection and interception of incoming missiles or aircraft.*
- *One who loves and defends his or her country.*
- *A person who vigorously supports their country and is prepared to defend it against enemies or detractors.*



Synonyms of "Patriot" as a noun (2 Words)

loyalist A person who is loyal to their allegiance (especially in times of revolt.
*Tory **loyalists**.*

nationalist A person who advocates or supports the political independence of a particular nation or people.
*A Basque **nationalist**.*

- armed** Equipped with or carrying a firearm or firearms.
*A lion rampant argent **armed** and langued azure.*
- army** The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.
***Army** officers.*
- blind** Make blind by putting the eyes out.
*The criminals were punished and **blinded**.*
- chauvinism** Fanatical patriotism.
*Public opinion was easily moved to **chauvinism** and nationalism.*
- chauvinist** A person with a prejudiced belief in the superiority of his or her own kind.
*A **chauvinist** rejection of foreign interference.*

| chauvinistic | Feeling or displaying aggressive or exaggerated patriotism. <i>She overcomes the surly objections of her chauvinistic editor to uncover the truth.</i> |
| colonialism | Exploitation by a stronger country of weaker one; the use of the weaker country's resources to strengthen and enrich the stronger country. <i>The state apparatus that was dominant under colonialism.</i> |
| consul | Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). <i>The British consul in Israel.</i> |
| devoted | Zealous in devotion or affection. <i>A devoted husband and father.</i> |
| diplomat | A person who deals tactfully with others. |
| diplomatist | An official engaged in international negotiations. |
| ethnic | A member of an ethnic minority. <i>Ethnic and cultural rights and traditions.</i> |
| insurgence | An organized rebellion aimed at overthrowing a constituted government through the use of subversion and armed conflict. <i>There has been an insurgence of books about healthcare.</i> |
| jingo | An extreme bellicose nationalist. <i>The feverish excitement of the jingo crowds.</i> |
| jingoism | Extreme patriotism, especially in the form of aggressive or warlike foreign policy. <i>The popular jingoism that swept the lower middle classes.</i> |
| jingoist | An extreme bellicose nationalist. |
| loyal | Giving or showing firm and constant support or allegiance to a person or institution. <i>He remained loyal to the government.</i> |
| militarism | The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of militarism.</i> |
| nation | The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee nation.</i> |
| nationalism | Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. <i>Scottish nationalism.</i> |
| nationalist | Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>Minor nationalistic differences.</i> |
| officer | Provide with military officers. <i>He is the officer in charge of the ship s engines.</i> |

- patriotic** Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country.
*Today's game will be played before a fiercely **patriotic** crowd.*
- patriotism** The quality of being patriotic; devotion to and vigorous support for one's country.
*They rode the same wave of popular **patriotism**.*
- politician** A person active in party politics.
*A local **politician**.*
- politics** The study of government of states and other political units.
*In the conduct of global **politics** economic status must be backed by military capacity.*
- socialist** Advocating or following the socialist principles.
*The history of **socialist** movement.*
- statesman** A skilled, experienced, and respected political leader or figure.
Guests included members of the European royal families, diplomats, and statesmen.
- vanguard** A group of people leading the way in new developments or ideas.
*The experimental spirit of the modernist **vanguard**.*
- warmonger** A person who advocates war or warlike policies.
