- A person who vigorously supports their country and is prepared to defend it against enemies or detractors.






### Synonyms of "Patriot" as a noun (2 Words)

# Associations of "Patriot" (30 Words)

armed	Equipped with or carrying a firearm or firearms. A lion rampant argent <b>armed</b> and langued azure.
<u>army</u>	The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare. <i>Army officers.</i>
<u>blind</u>	Make blind by putting the eyes out. The criminals were punished and <b>blind</b> ed.
<u>chauvinism</u>	Fanatical patriotism. Public opinion was easily moved to <b>chauvinism</b> and nationalism.
chauvinist	A person with a prejudiced belief in the superiority of his or her own kind. A <b>chauvinist</b> rejection of foreign interference.



chauvinistic	Feeling or displaying aggressive or exaggerated patriotism. She overcomes the surly objections of her <b>chauvinistic</b> editor to uncover the truth.
<u>colonialism</u>	Exploitation by a stronger country of weaker one; the use of the weaker country's resources to strengthen and enrich the stronger country. <i>The state apparatus that was dominant under colonialism.</i>
consul	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.
<u>devoted</u>	Zealous in devotion or affection. A <b>devoted</b> husband and father.
diplomat	A person who deals tactfully with others.
diplomatist	An official engaged in international negotiations.
ethnic	A member of an ethnic minority. <i>Ethnic</i> and cultural rights and traditions.
insurgence	An organized rebellion aimed at overthrowing a constituted government through the use of subversion and armed conflict. <i>There has been an <b>insurgence</b> of books about healthcare.</i>
jingo	An extreme bellicose nationalist. The feverish excitement of the <b>jingo</b> crowds.
jingoism	Extreme patriotism, especially in the form of aggressive or warlike foreign policy. The popular <b>jingoism</b> that swept the lower middle classes.
jingoist	An extreme bellicose nationalist.
<u>loyal</u>	Giving or showing firm and constant support or allegiance to a person or institution. <i>He remained loyal to the government.</i>
militarism	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of militarism</i> .
<u>nation</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee <b>nation</b></i> .
nationalism	Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. Scottish <b>nationalism</b> .
nationalist	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. Minor <b>nationalist</b> ic differences.
officer	Provide with military officers. He is the <b>officer</b> in charge of the ship s engines.



patriotic	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. Today s game will be played before a fiercely <b>patriotic</b> crowd.
<u>patriotism</u>	The quality of being patriotic; devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. They rode the same wave of popular <b>patriotism</b> .
<u>politician</u>	A person active in party politics. <i>A local <b>politician</b>.</i>
<u>politics</u>	The study of government of states and other political units. In the conduct of global <b>politics</b> economic status must be backed by military capacity.
socialist	Advocating or following the socialist principles. The history of <b>socialist</b> movement.
statesman	A skilled, experienced, and respected political leader or figure. Guests included members of the European royal families, diplomats, and statesmen.
<u>vanguard</u>	A group of people leading the way in new developments or ideas. The experimental spirit of the modernist <b>vanguard</b> .
warmonger	A person who advocates war or warlike policies.
