According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “patriot” as a noun can have the following definitions:

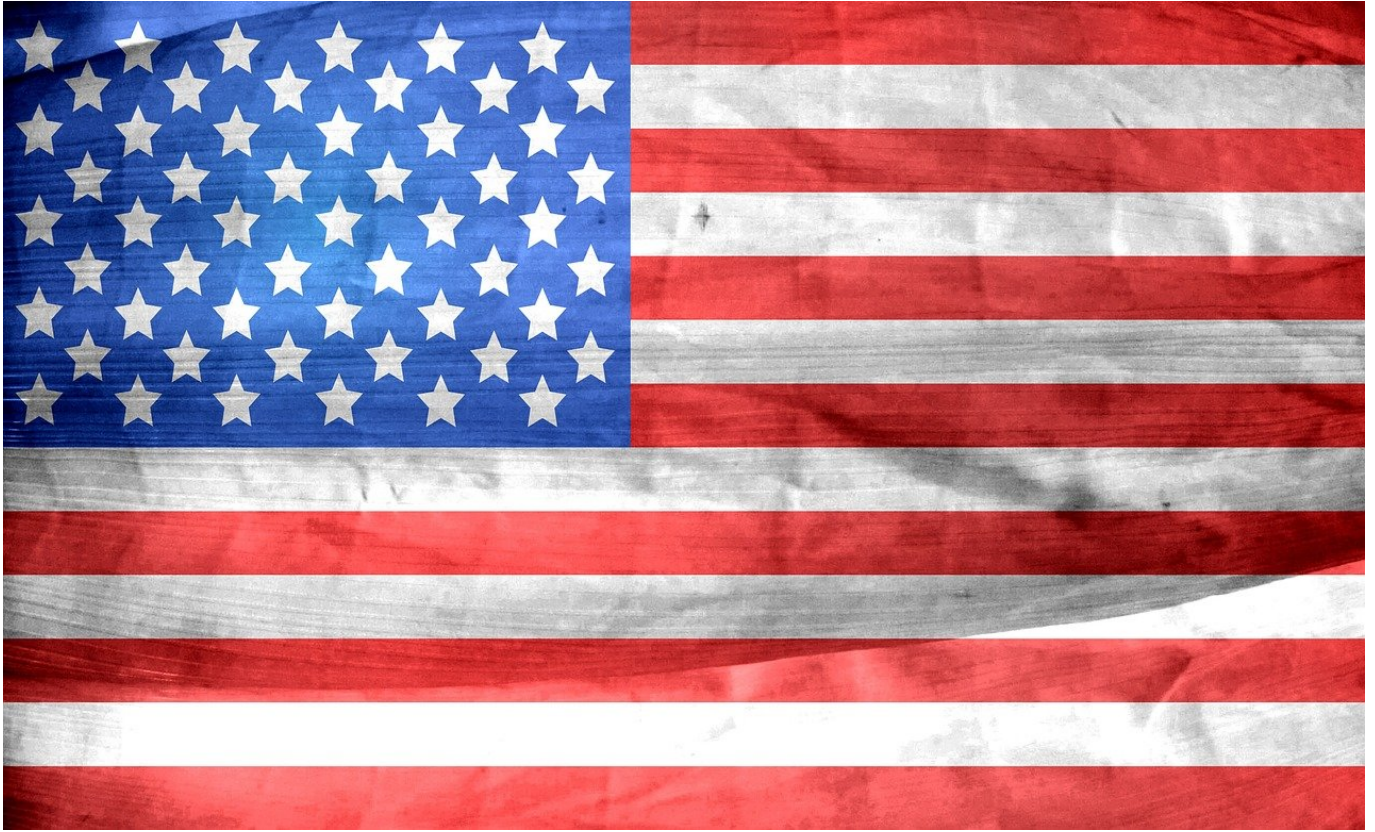
- *An automated surface-to-air missile designed for early detection and interception of incoming missiles or aircraft.*
- *One who loves and defends his or her country.*
- *A person who vigorously supports their country and is prepared to defend it against enemies or detractors.*



### Synonyms of "Patriot" as a noun (2 Words)

**loyalist** A person who is loyal to their allegiance (especially in times of revolt.  
*Tory **loyalists**.*

**nationalist** A person who advocates or supports the political independence of a particular nation or people.  
*A Basque **nationalist**.*

## Associations of "Patriot" (30 Words)

- armed** Equipped with or carrying a firearm or firearms.  
*A lion rampant argent **armed** and langued azure.*
- army** The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.  
***Army** officers.*
- blind** Make blind by putting the eyes out.  
*The criminals were punished and **blinded**.*
- chauvinism** Fanatical patriotism.  
*Public opinion was easily moved to **chauvinism** and nationalism.*
- chauvinist** A person with a prejudiced belief in the superiority of his or her own kind.  
*A **chauvinist** rejection of foreign interference.*

<b>chauvinistic</b>	Feeling or displaying aggressive or exaggerated patriotism. <i>She overcomes the surly objections of her <b>chauvinistic</b> editor to uncover the truth.</i>
<b>colonialism</b>	Exploitation by a stronger country of weaker one; the use of the weaker country's resources to strengthen and enrich the stronger country. <i>The state apparatus that was dominant under <b>colonialism</b>.</i>
<b>consul</b>	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>devoted</b>	Zealous in devotion or affection. <i>A <b>devoted</b> husband and father.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who deals tactfully with others.
<b>diplomatist</b>	An official engaged in international negotiations.
<b>ethnic</b>	A member of an ethnic minority. <i><b>Ethnic</b> and cultural rights and traditions.</i>
<b>insurgence</b>	An organized rebellion aimed at overthrowing a constituted government through the use of subversion and armed conflict. <i>There has been an <b>insurgence</b> of books about healthcare.</i>
<b>jingo</b>	An extreme bellicose nationalist. <i>The feverish excitement of the <b>jingo</b> crowds.</i>
<b>jingoism</b>	Extreme patriotism, especially in the form of aggressive or warlike foreign policy. <i>The popular <b>jingoism</b> that swept the lower middle classes.</i>
<b>jingoist</b>	An extreme bellicose nationalist.
<b>loyal</b>	Giving or showing firm and constant support or allegiance to a person or institution. <i>He remained <b>loyal</b> to the government.</i>
<b>militarism</b>	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of <b>militarism</b>.</i>
<b>nation</b>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee <b>nation</b>.</i>
<b>nationalism</b>	Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. <i>Scottish <b>nationalism</b>.</i>
<b>nationalist</b>	Relating to nationalists or nationalism. <i>Minor <b>nationalistic</b> differences.</i>
<b>officer</b>	Provide with military officers. <i>He is the <b>officer</b> in charge of the ship s engines.</i>

<b>patriotic</b>	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>Today's game will be played before a fiercely <b>patriotic</b> crowd.</i>
<b>patriotism</b>	The quality of being patriotic; devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>They rode the same wave of popular <b>patriotism</b>.</i>
<b>politician</b>	A person active in party politics. <i>A local <b>politician</b>.</i>
<b>politics</b>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>In the conduct of global <b>politics</b> economic status must be backed by military capacity.</i>
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>The history of <b>socialist</b> movement.</i>
<b>statesman</b>	A skilled, experienced, and respected political leader or figure. <i>Guests included members of the European royal families, diplomats, and statesmen.</i>
<b>vanguard</b>	A group of people leading the way in new developments or ideas. <i>The experimental spirit of the modernist <b>vanguard</b>.</i>
<b>warmonger</b>	A person who advocates war or warlike policies.
