hush	Become quiet or still; fall silent. <i>Hush my baby.</i>
imperturbable	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>An imperturbable self possession.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
pacific	A steam locomotive of 4-6-2 wheel arrangement. <i>A pacific gesture.</i>

pacification	Actions taken by a government to defeat insurgency. <i>A wonderful skill in the pacification of crying infants.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>They settle their disputes by peaceful means.</i>
placid	Not easily upset or excited. <i>Not everyone shared his placid temperament.</i>
poise	Composure and dignity of manner. <i>The balance has passed the point where the spring is in poise.</i>
quiet	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>There are ways of quieting kids down.</i>
quietly	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>She was quietly confident that they'd win.</i>
quietness	Absence of noise or bustle; calm. <i>Grandpa's sudden quietness was disconcerting.</i>
quietude	A state of stillness, calmness, and quiet in a person or place. <i>A moment of quietude.</i>
rapprochement	(especially in international affairs) an establishment or resumption of harmonious relations. <i>There were signs of a growing rapprochement between the two countries.</i>
reconciliation	Getting two things to correspond. <i>The reconciliation of his checkbook and the bank statement.</i>
restful	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and restful.</i>
reticence	The trait of being uncommunicative; not volunteering anything more than necessary. <i>The traditional emotional reticence of the British.</i>
serenity	The state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
stillness	(poetic) tranquil silence. <i>Absolute stillness greeted our gaze.</i>
tranquil	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A lake of tranquil blue water reflecting a tranquil blue sky.</i>
tranquility	A disposition free from stress or emotion.

tranquillity

An untroubled state; free from disturbances.

*Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the **tranquillity** of rural life.*

unflappable

Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure.

*Self contained **unflappable** Glaswegian common sense.*
