<b>brim</b>	A circular projection that sticks outward from the crown of a hat. <i>A soft hat with a turned up <b>brim</b>.</i>
<b>brow</b>	An eyebrow. <i>He wiped his <b>brow</b>.</i>
<b>cap</b>	A player to whom a cap is awarded. <i>They established a <b>cap</b> for prices.</i>
<b>consummation</b>	The act of bringing to completion or fruition. <i>The eager <b>consummation</b> that follows a long and passionate seduction.</i>
<b>crag</b>	A steep rugged rock or cliff.
<b>crest</b>	(heraldry) in medieval times, an emblem used to decorate a helmet. <i>A high wave formed by the meeting of two <b>crests</b>.</i>
<a href="#">crown</a>	Dentistry dental appliance consisting of an artificial crown for a broken or decayed tooth. <i>Tomorrow my dentist will fit me for a <b>crown</b>.</i>

<b>crowning point</b>	The part of a hat (the vertex) that covers the crown of the head.
<b>culmination</b>	(astronomy) a heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>The deal marked the <b>culmination</b> of years of negotiation.</i>
<b>efflorescence</b>	Rapid growth or development. <i>The state is enjoying an incomparable cultural <b>efflorescence</b>.</i>
<b><u>elevation</u></b>	A scale drawing showing the vertical projection of one side of a building. <i>A dancer of exceptional <b>elevation</b>.</i>
<b><u>epitome</u></b>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the <b>epitome</b> of elegance and good taste.</i>
<b>extremum</b>	The most extreme possible amount or value. <i><b>Extremum</b> principles.</i>
<b>eyeshade</b>	A brim that projects to the front to shade the eyes. <i>The stereotype of the forger as the chap with the green <b>eyeshade</b> and specs.</i>
<b>flower</b>	The state or period in which a plant's flowers have developed and opened. <i>He wasted the <b>flower</b> of French youth on his dreams of empire.</i>
<b><u>flush</u></b>	The device used for flushing a toilet. <i>He is no longer in the first <b>flush</b> of youth.</i>
<b><u>height</u></b>	A high place or position. <i>It would be the <b>height</b> of bad manners not to attend the wedding.</i>
<b>heights</b>	The distance from head to foot. <i>He doesn't like <b>heights</b>.</i>
<b>heyday</b>	The period of greatest prosperity or productivity. <i>The paper has lost millions of readers since its <b>heyday</b> in 1964.</i>
<b>high point</b>	A lofty level or position or degree.
<b>high spot</b>	A state of altered consciousness induced by alcohol or narcotics.
<b>highlight</b>	The best parts of a sporting or other event edited for broadcasting or recording. <i>He views that season as the <b>highlight</b> of his career.</i>
<b><u>hill</u></b>	Risque English comedian (1925-1992). <i>A <b>hill</b> of sliding shingle.</i>
<b>inselberg</b>	An isolated hill or mountain rising abruptly from a plain.

<b>meridian</b>	A circle passing through the celestial poles and the zenith of a given place on the earth's surface. <i>The European Broadcasting Area extends from the Atlantic to the <b>meridian</b> 40 E.</i>
<b>mountain</b>	(often followed by `of') a large number or amount or extent. <i>We set off down the <b>mountain</b>.</i>
<b>mountaintop</b>	The area at the top of a mountain. <i>The <b>mountaintop</b> castle.</i>
<b>peak of perfection</b>	The most extreme possible amount or value.
<b>pinnacle</b>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.</i>
<b>point</b>	The action or position of a dog in pointing. <i>The furthestmost <b>point</b> of the gallery.</i>

**vizor**

A piece of armor plate (with eye slits) fixed or hinged to a medieval helmet to protect the face.

**zenith**

The highest point reached by a given celestial object.  
*In 1977 punk was at its **zenith**.*

**top out** Pass by, over, or under without making contact.

<b>crest</b>	Reach a high point. <i>The swell begins to curl and <b>crest</b>.</i>
<b>culminate</b>	Reach the highest or most decisive point. <i>Seurat <b>culminated</b> pointillism.</i>
<b>culmination</b>	(astronomy) a heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>The deal marked the <b>culmination</b> of years of negotiation.</i>
<b>dramatic</b>	Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect. <i>A <b>dramatic</b> increase in recorded crime.</i>
<b>elevation</b>	Height above a given level, especially sea level. <i>A prayer recommended for lay people at the <b>elevation</b> of the Host.</i>
<b>final</b>	A series of games constituting the final stage of a competition. <i>The <b>final</b> answer.</i>
<b>heyday</b>	The period of greatest prosperity or productivity. <i>The paper has lost millions of readers since its <b>heyday</b> in 1964.</i>
<b>jag</b>	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>She <b>jagged</b> herself in the mouth.</i>
<b>lofty</b>	Haughty and aloof. <i><b>Lofty</b> ships.</i>
<b>maximum</b>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>A <b>maximum</b> penalty of ten years imprisonment.</i>
<b>meridian</b>	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>At the end of February Jupiter transits the <b>meridian</b> due south at 6 15 a m.</i>
<b>minaret</b>	A slender tower, typically part of a mosque, with a balcony from which a muezzin calls Muslims to prayer.
<b>nadir</b>	An extreme state of adversity; the lowest point of anything. <i>Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.</i>
<b>pinnacle</b>	Set on or as if on a pinnacle. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.</i>
<b>plateau</b>	A state of little or no change following a period of activity or progress. <i>The peace process had reached a <b>plateau</b>.</i>
<b>summit</b>	Reach the summit of a mountain. <i>A <b>summit</b> meeting.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>Chilli has become the <b>superlative</b> among spices.</i>



- top** Reach the top of a hill or other elevation.  
*I use the sharp edge of an old butcher s knife for **topping** and the back of the blade for cleaning the roots.*
- towering** Of great importance or influence.  
*Hari looked up at the **towering** buildings.*
- unsurpassed** Not capable of being improved on.  
*The quality of workmanship is **unsurpassed**.*
- upper** A central nervous system stimulant that increases energy and decreases appetite; used to treat narcolepsy and some forms of depression.  
*The **upper** half of the class.*
- windup** Operated by a mechanism.  
***Windup** toys.*
- zenith** The point in the sky or celestial sphere directly above an observer.  
*The sun was well past the **zenith**.*
