<b>footer</b>	The height or length of something in feet used only in combinations footer nou a person who travels by foot. <i>He hammered a low left <b>footer</b> past the keeper.</i>
<b>footslogger</b>	Fights on foot with small arms.
<b>hiker</b>	A foot traveler; someone who goes on an extended walk (for pleasure. <i>He was a <b>hiker</b> of taxes.</i>
<b>person on foot</b>	A human being.
<b>rambler</b>	A person who walks in the countryside for pleasure. <i>A <b>ramblers</b> club.</i>
<b>stroller</b>	A person taking a leisurely walk. <i>A little <b>stroller</b> taps on the window and cups his hands in a begging gesture.</i>

**walker**

New Zealand runner who in 1975 became the first person to run a mile in less than 3 minutes and 50 seconds (born in 1952).

*He was a keen **walker**.*

**wayfarer**

A person who travels on foot.

## Synonyms of "Pedestrian" as an adjective (19 Words)

<b>boring</b>	Not interesting; tedious. <i>I've got a <b>boring</b> job in an office.</i>
<b><u>dry</u></b>	Of noodles not served in a soup but in a sauce or with dry ingredients. <i>Cream conditioners for <b>dry</b> hair.</i>
<b>dull</b>	(of pain) indistinctly felt; not acute. <i>His face glowed in the <b>dull</b> lamplight.</i>
<b>earthbound</b>	Limited to material existence as distinct from a spiritual or heavenly one. <i>An <b>earthbound</b> spaceship.</i>
<b><u>lifeless</u></b>	Lacking animation or excitement or activity. <i>A <b>lifeless</b> body.</i>
<b><u>monotonous</u></b>	(of a sound or utterance) lacking in variation in tone or pitch. <i>The statistics that he quotes with <b>monotonous</b> regularity.</i>
<b>plodding</b>	Slow and laborious. <i><b>Plodding</b> methodical Ralph Bellamy.</i>

<b>prosaic</b>	Not challenging; dull and lacking excitement. <i>The masses were too preoccupied by <b>prosaic</b> day to day concerns.</i>
<b>prosy</b>	Lacking wit or imagination. <i>He junked most of the <b>prosy</b> script his handlers had written for him.</i>
<b><u>tedious</u></b>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i><b>Tedious</b> days on the train.</i>
<b><u>tiresome</u></b>	Causing one to feel bored or annoyed. <i>The <b>tiresome</b> chirping of a cricket.</i>
<b>uncreative</b>	Not having or involving imagination or original ideas. <i>Repetitive and <b>uncreative</b> work.</i>
<b><u>uneventful</u></b>	Marked by no noteworthy or significant events. <i>A place where dull people lead <b>uneventful</b> lives.</i>
<b>unexciting</b>	Not exciting; dull. <i>An <b>unexciting</b> novel.</i>
<b>unimaginative</b>	Dealing only with concrete facts. <i>Even his profanity was <b>unimaginative</b>.</i>
<b>uninspired</b>	Lacking in imagination or originality. <i><b>Uninspired</b> writing.</i>
<b>uninteresting</b>	Arousing no interest or attention or curiosity or excitement. <i>A very <b>uninteresting</b> account of her trip.</i>
<b><u>unremarkable</u></b>	Not particularly interesting or surprising. <i>His early childhood was <b>unremarkable</b>.</i>
<b>wearisome</b>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>They have schedules and inventories that tell them in <b>wearisome</b> detail what they should look for.</i>

## Associations of "Pedestrian" (30 Words)

<b><u>asphalt</u></b>	Cover with tar or asphalt. <i><b>Asphalt</b> the driveway.</i>
<b><u>avenue</u></b>	A wide street or thoroughfare. <i>An <b>avenue</b> of limes.</i>
<b>boulevard</b>	A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees. <i>Sunset <b>Boulevard</b>.</i>
<b>crisscross</b>	Marked with crossing lines. <i>Wrinkles <b>crisscrossed</b> her face.</i>
<b><u>cross</u></b>	Travel across or pass over. <i>Mendel tried <b>crossbreeding</b>.</i>
<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>The cathedral has a lantern tower over the <b>crossing</b>.</i>



<b><u>crossover</u></b>	A point or place of crossing from one side to the other. <i>A jazz classical <b>crossover</b> album.</i>
<b>crossroad</b>	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
<b>crosswalk</b>	A marked part of a road where pedestrians have right of way to cross; a pedestrian crossing.
<b>delineation</b>	The action of describing or portraying something precisely. <i>The eventual <b>delineation</b> of the border between the two states.</i>
<b>drawbridge</b>	A bridge, especially one over a castle's moat, which is hinged at one end so that it may be raised to prevent people crossing or to allow vessels to pass under it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the <b>drawbridge</b> was lowered.</i>
<b>driveway</b>	A road leading up to a private house. <i>One of the suspects backed a vehicle into the <b>driveway</b>.</i>
<b>fordable</b>	Shallow enough to be crossed by walking or riding on an animal or in a vehicle. <i>The stream was <b>fordable</b>.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	Meet at a point. <i>The area is <b>intersected</b> only by minor roads.</i>
<b><u>intersection</u></b>	The set of elements common to two or more sets. <i>The <b>intersection</b> of a plane and a cone.</i>
<b>jaywalk</b>	Cross the road at a red light. <i>You <b>jaywalked</b> across a busy four lane street.</i>
<b>junction</b>	The shape or manner in which things come together and a connection is made. <i>The <b>junction</b> of two roundels produces a triangular space.</i>
<b>lamppost</b>	A metal post supporting an outdoor lamp (such as a streetlight).
<b><u>overlap</u></b>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>There are many <b>overlaps</b> between the approaches.</i>
<b>overpass</b>	Bridge formed by the upper level of a crossing of two highways at different levels. <i>Did not its sublimity <b>overpass</b> a little the bounds of the ridiculous.</i>
<b>pavement</b>	The hard surface of a road or street. <i>He fell and hit his head on the <b>pavement</b>.</i>
<b><u>road</u></b>	A railroad. <i>A <b>road</b> accident.</i>
<b>roadway</b>	The part of a bridge or railway used by traffic.

- route** Send via a specific route.  
*All lines of communication were **routed** through London.*
- sidewalk** Walk consisting of a paved area for pedestrians; usually beside a street or roadway.
- skyway** A covered overhead walkway between buildings.  
***Skyways** from 18 000 to 40 000 feet resemble a highway system.*
- street** People living or working on the same street.  
*London **street** style.*
- walk** Walk at a pace.  
*There are picnic places and waymarked **walks**.*
- walker** A shoe designed for comfortable walking.  
*A fell **walker**.*
- walkway** A path set aside for walking.
