## Associations of "Pent up" (30 Words)

<b>ascend</b>	(of a road or flight of steps) slope or lead up. <i>The road <b>ascends</b> to the loch.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>A gently <b>ascending</b> forest path.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An upward slope or path that one may walk or climb. <i>The <b>ascent</b> grew steeper.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The singer had to be <b>boosted</b> onto the stage by a special contraption.</i>
<b><u>climb</u></b>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>He <b>climbed</b> up the steps slowly.</i>
<b><u>climbing</u></b>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>His other great interest was <b>climbing</b> especially in the Alps.</i>
<b><u>elevate</u></b>	Raise in rank or condition. <i>He was <b>elevated</b> to Secretary of State.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>In the <b>elevator</b> she pressed the button for the lobby.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<b>high</b>	Of a singer or instrument producing notes of relatively high pitch. <i>The sculpture stood about five feet <b>high</b>.</i>
<b><u>hoist</u></b>	Raise or haul up. <i><b>Hoist</b> the bicycle onto the roof of the car.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>Employees on their way up the career <b>ladder</b>.</i>

<b>lift</b>	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i><b>Lift</b> the pressure.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b>precipitate</b>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>They were <b>precipitated</b> into a conflict for which they were quite unprepared.</i>
<b>promote</b>	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>Some regulation is still required to <b>promote</b> competition.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i><b>Raise</b> the specter of unemployment.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise up. <i>The judge's remark heralded the signal for the court to <b>rise</b>.</i>
<b>risen</b>	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Newly come into prominence. <i>The reforms led to peasant <b>risings</b>.</i>
<b>soar</b>	Go or move upward. <i>The bird spread its wings and <b>soared</b> into the air.</i>
<b>soaring</b>	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>You may spy bighorn sheep and <b>soaring</b> eagles.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b>top</b>	The top or extreme point of something usually a mountain or hill. <i>The car has a <b>top</b> speed of 125 mph.</i>
<b>uphill</b>	An upward slope. <i>An <b>uphill</b> struggle to gain worldwide recognition.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	With respect to the mind. <i>They lived <b>upstairs</b>.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>She peered <b>upward</b> at the sky.</i>
<b>vertically</b>	In a vertical direction. <i><b>Vertically</b> stacked books.</i>
<b>zoom</b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>We watched the fly <b>zooming</b> around.</i>
