discourse	To consider or examine in speech or writing. <i>A discourse on critical theory.</i>
discuss	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>They were discussing where to go for a drink.</i>
disputation	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. <i>The founding father of logical disputation.</i>

expound	State. <i>He was expounding a powerful argument.</i>
foregoing	The things just mentioned or stated. <i>The foregoing analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
forum	A public facility to meet for open discussion. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
gossip	Engage in gossip. <i>She just comes round here for a gossip.</i>
mention	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>She made frequent mention of her promotion.</i>
prate	Idle or foolish and irrelevant talk. <i>I heard him prate on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
quote	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>A garage quoted him 30.</i>
recitative	Musical declamation of the kind usual in the narrative and dialogue parts of opera and oratorio, sung in the rhythm of ordinary speech with many words on the same note. <i>Singing in recitative.</i>
remark	A statement that expresses a personal opinion or belief or adds information. <i>The landscape familiar since childhood was not worthy of remark.</i>
rumor	Tell or spread rumors. <i>It was rumored that the next president would be a woman.</i>
saying	A short, pithy, commonly known expression which generally offers advice or wisdom. <i>This is stated in the sayings of the Prophet.</i>
speak	Say something in order to convey information or to express a feeling. <i>The prisoner won't speak.</i>
speaker	A person who speaks a specified language. <i>The speaker at commencement.</i>
talker	A talkative person. <i>She's quite a talker conversing and arguing with Henry.</i>
verbalize	Articulate; either verbally or with a cry, shout, or noise. <i>They are unable to verbalize their real feelings.</i>
verbosity	An expressive style that uses excessive or empty words. <i>A critic with a reputation for verbosity.</i>
