<b>confabulate</b>	Unconsciously replace fact with fantasy in one’s memory. <i>She could be heard on the telephone confabulating with someone.</i>
<a href="#">confer</a>	Have a conference in order to talk something over. <i>The officials were <b>conferring</b> with allies.</i>
<b>consult</b>	An act of consulting a professional a consultation. <i>Patients are entitled to be <b>consulted</b> about their treatment.</i>
<b>consultation</b>	The action or process of formally consulting or discussing. <i>Frequent <b>consultations</b> with his lawyer.</i>
<b>dialog</b>	A literary composition in the form of a conversation between two people.
<a href="#">dialogue</a>	Provide a film or play with a dialogue. <i>Interfaith <b>dialogue</b>.</i>
<a href="#">discourse</a>	To consider or examine in speech or writing. <i>A <b>discourse</b> on critical theory.</i>
<b>discuss</b>	Speak with others about something talk something over in detail have a discussion. <i>They were <b>discussing</b> where to go for a drink.</i>
<b>disputation</b>	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. <i>The founding father of logical <b>disputation</b>.</i>

<b>expound</b>	State. <i>He was <b>expounding</b> a powerful argument.</i>
<b>foregoing</b>	The things just mentioned or stated. <i>The <b>foregoing</b> analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
<b>forum</b>	A public facility to meet for open discussion. <i>We hope these pages act as a <b>forum</b> for debate.</i>
<b>gossip</b>	Engage in gossip. <i>She just comes round here for a <b>gossip</b>.</i>
<b>mention</b>	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>She made frequent <b>mention</b> of her promotion.</i>
<b>prate</b>	Idle or foolish and irrelevant talk. <i>I heard him <b>prate</b> on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
<b>quote</b>	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>A garage <b>quoted</b> him 30.</i>
<b>recitative</b>	Musical declamation of the kind usual in the narrative and dialogue parts of opera and oratorio, sung in the rhythm of ordinary speech with many words on the same note. <i>Singing in <b>recitative</b>.</i>
<b>remark</b>	A statement that expresses a personal opinion or belief or adds information. <i>The landscape familiar since childhood was not worthy of <b>remark</b>.</i>
<b>rumor</b>	Tell or spread rumors. <i>It was <b>rumored</b> that the next president would be a woman.</i>
<b>saying</b>	A short, pithy, commonly known expression which generally offers advice or wisdom. <i>This is stated in the <b>sayings</b> of the Prophet.</i>
<b>speak</b>	Say something in order to convey information or to express a feeling. <i>The prisoner won't <b>speak</b>.</i>
<b>speaker</b>	A person who speaks a specified language. <i>The <b>speaker</b> at commencement.</i>
<b>talker</b>	A talkative person. <i>She's quite a <b>talker</b> conversing and arguing with Henry.</i>
<b>verbalize</b>	Articulate; either verbally or with a cry, shout, or noise. <i>They are unable to <b>verbalize</b> their real feelings.</i>
<b>verbosity</b>	An expressive style that uses excessive or empty words. <i>A critic with a reputation for <b>verbosity</b>.</i>
