## Associations of "Per usual" (30 Words)

<a href="#">accustomed</a>	Commonly used or practiced; usual. <i>His <b>accustomed</b> route.</i>
<a href="#">banal</a>	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>Songs with <b>banal</b> repeated words.</i>
<a href="#">bland</a>	Smoothly agreeable and courteous with a degree of sophistication. <i>A <b>bland</b> little drama.</i>
<b>checkup</b>	A thorough physical examination; includes a variety of tests depending on the age and sex and health of the person.
<b>chronic</b>	Of a person having a chronic illness. <i>A <b>chronic</b> invalid.</i>
<b>common</b>	Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual. <i>Salt and pepper are the two most <b>common</b> seasonings.</i>
<b>commonplace</b>	A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book. <i>The usual <b>commonplace</b> remarks.</i>
<a href="#">commute</a>	Travel back and forth regularly, as between one's place of work and home. <i>If he had <b>commuted</b> some of his pension he would have received 330 000.</i>
<b>conventional</b>	Unimaginative and conformist. <i>You re a bit too well brought up a bit too <b>conventional</b>.</i>
<b>customary</b>	According to a person's habitual practice. <i>I put the kettle on for our <b>customary</b> cup of coffee.</i>
<b>featureless</b>	Lacking distinctive attributes or aspects. <i>The <b>featureless</b> landscape of the steppe.</i>
<b>habit</b>	Put a habit on. <i>A victim to a consumptive <b>habit</b>.</i>
<b>habitual</b>	Doing something constantly or regularly. <i>A <b>habitual</b> late sleeper.</i>

<b>inveterate</b>	In a habitual and longstanding manner. <i>His <b>inveterate</b> hostility to what he considered to be the reactionary powers.</i>
<b>lackluster</b>	Lacking luster or shine. <i>Staring with <b>lackluster</b> eyes.</i>
<b>mediocre</b>	Of only average quality; not very good. <i>They improved the quality from <b>mediocre</b> to above average.</i>
<b>mundane</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>According to the Shinto doctrine spirits of the dead can act upon the <b>mundane</b> world.</i>
<b>nondescript</b>	A nondescript person or thing. <i>A <b>nondescript</b> novel.</i>
<b>normal</b>	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. <i>The most <b>normal</b> person I ve ever met.</i>
<b>ordinary</b>	Any of several conventional figures used on shields. <i>The <b>ordinary</b> or common man in the street.</i>
<b>quotidian</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events- Anita Diamant. <i>His story is an achingly human one mired in <b>quotidian</b> details.</i>
<b>regular</b>	A regular customer member of a team etc. <i>Plant the flags at <b>regular</b> intervals.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Organize according to a routine. <i>I settled down into a <b>routine</b> of work and sleep.</i>
<b>spate</b>	A large number or amount or extent. <i>A <b>spate</b> of attacks on holidaymakers.</i>
<b>stereotyped</b>	Lacking spontaneity or originality or individuality. <i>The film is weakened by its <b>stereotyped</b> characters.</i>
<b>typical</b>	Of a feature that helps to distinguish a person or thing. <i>How <b>typical</b> of Iris to think of such a detail.</i>
<b>unexceptional</b>	Not out of the ordinary; usual. <i>A <b>unexceptional</b> incident as can be found in a lawyer s career.</i>
<b>unremarkable</b>	Not particularly interesting or surprising. <i>His early childhood was <b>unremarkable</b>.</i>
<b>wont</b>	(of a person) in the habit of doing something; accustomed. <i>Constance as was her <b>wont</b> had paid her little attention.</i>
<b>workday</b>	A day on which work is done. <i>Saturdays were <b>workdays</b> for him.</i>
