Associations of "Per usual" (30 Words)

accustomed	Commonly used or practiced; usual. <i>His accustomed route.</i>
banal	Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse. <i>Songs with banal repeated words.</i>
bland	Smoothly agreeable and courteous with a degree of sophistication. <i>A bland little drama.</i>
checkup	A thorough physical examination; includes a variety of tests depending on the age and sex and health of the person.
chronic	Of a person having a chronic illness. <i>A chronic invalid.</i>
common	Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual. <i>Salt and pepper are the two most common seasonings.</i>
commonplace	A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book. <i>The usual commonplace remarks.</i>
commute	Travel back and forth regularly, as between one's place of work and home. <i>If he had commuted some of his pension he would have received 330 000.</i>
conventional	Unimaginative and conformist. <i>You re a bit too well brought up a bit too conventional.</i>
customary	According to a person's habitual practice. <i>I put the kettle on for our customary cup of coffee.</i>
featureless	Lacking distinctive attributes or aspects. <i>The featureless landscape of the steppe.</i>
habit	Put a habit on. <i>A victim to a consumptive habit.</i>
habitual	Doing something constantly or regularly. <i>A habitual late sleeper.</i>

inveterate	In a habitual and longstanding manner. <i>His inveterate hostility to what he considered to be the reactionary powers.</i>
lackluster	Lacking luster or shine. <i>Staring with lackluster eyes.</i>
mediocre	Of only average quality; not very good. <i>They improved the quality from mediocre to above average.</i>
mundane	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>According to the Shinto doctrine spirits of the dead can act upon the mundane world.</i>
nondescript	A nondescript person or thing. <i>A nondescript novel.</i>
normal	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. <i>The most normal person I've ever met.</i>
ordinary	Any of several conventional figures used on shields. <i>The ordinary or common man in the street.</i>
quotidian	Found in the ordinary course of events- Anita Diamant. <i>His story is an achingly human one mired in quotidian details.</i>
regular	A regular customer member of a team etc. <i>Plant the flags at regular intervals.</i>
routine	Organize according to a routine. <i>I settled down into a routine of work and sleep.</i>
spate	A large number or amount or extent. <i>A spate of attacks on holidaymakers.</i>
stereotyped	Lacking spontaneity or originality or individuality. <i>The film is weakened by its stereotyped characters.</i>
typical	Of a feature that helps to distinguish a person or thing. <i>How typical of Iris to think of such a detail.</i>
unexceptional	Not out of the ordinary; usual. <i>A unexceptional incident as can be found in a lawyer's career.</i>
unremarkable	Not particularly interesting or surprising. <i>His early childhood was unremarkable.</i>
wont	(of a person) in the habit of doing something; accustomed. <i>Constance as was her wont had paid her little attention.</i>
workday	A day on which work is done. <i>Saturdays were workdays for him.</i>
