### Definitions of "Perennial" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “perennial” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a stream or spring) flowing throughout the year.*
- *Apparently permanently engaged in a specified role or way of life.*
- *Lasting an indefinitely long time; suggesting self-renewal.*
- *Lasting three seasons or more.*
- *Recurring again and again.*
- *Lasting or existing for a long or apparently infinite time; enduring or continually recurring.*
- *(of a plant) living for several years.*

- abiding**            Unceasing.  
*He had an **abiding** respect for her.*
- ceaseless**            Constant and unending.  
*The fort was subjected to **ceaseless** bombardment.*
- constant**            Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.  
*In **constant** pain.*

<b><u>continual</u></b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The <b>continual</b> banging of the shutters.</i>
<b>continuing</b>	Remaining in force or being carried on without letup. <i>A <b>continuing</b> controversy.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>Time is <b>endless</b>.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Unceasing. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	(of truths, values, or questions) valid for all time; essentially unchanging. <i>To his <b>eternal</b> credit he maintained his dignity throughout.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>An <b>everlasting</b> reminder of this evening.</i>
<b><u>lasting</u></b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>They left a <b>lasting</b> impression.</i>
<b>never-ending</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place. <i>He s in a <b>permanent</b> state of rage.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Never ending or changing. <i>He grows <b>perpetual</b> flowering carnations.</i>
<b>persisting</b>	Relentless and indefatigable in pursuit or as if in pursuit.
<b><u>recurrent</u></b>	Recurring again and again. <i>She had a <b>recurrent</b> dream about falling.</i>
<b>repeated</b>	Done or occurring again several times in the same way. <i>There were <b>repeated</b> attempts to negotiate.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
<b><u>undying</u></b>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>Promises of <b>undying</b> love.</i>
<b><u>unending</u></b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>unending</b> bliss of heaven.</i>
<b><u>unfailing</u></b>	Always able to supply more. <i><b>Unfailing</b> loyalty.</i>

<b>ceaseless</b>	Constant and unending. <i>The fort was subjected to <b>ceaseless</b> bombardment.</i>
<b>constant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The condition of struggle remained a <b>constant</b>.</i>
<b>continual</b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i><b>Continual</b> is often used interchangeably with continuous.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>A <b>continuous</b> row of warehouses.</i>
<b>daily</b>	Relating to the period of a single day. <i>The museum is open <b>daily</b>.</i>
<b>every</b>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i><b>Every</b> party is welcome.</i>
<b>frequent</b>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. <i>Pubs <b>frequented</b> by soldiers.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>occasionally</b>	Now and then or here and there. <i>We met up <b>occasionally</b> for a drink.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>
<b>perennially</b>	In a perennial manner; repeatedly. <i><b>Perennially</b> popular destinations like Rome.</i>
<b>periodic</b>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The <b>periodic</b> appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
<b>periodical</b>	A publication that appears at fixed intervals. <i>Britain s best <b>periodical</b> art magazine.</i>
<b>periodically</b>	From time to time; occasionally. <i>The lamps were <b>periodically</b> switched on and off at 30 minute intervals.</i>
<b>recurrence</b>	Happening again (especially at regular intervals). <i>A drug used to prevent the <b>recurrence</b> of breast cancer.</i>
<b>recurrent</b>	Recurring again and again. <i>She had a <b>recurrent</b> dream about falling.</i>

<b><u>recurring</u></b>	(of a thought, image, or memory) repeatedly coming back to a person's mind. <i>They are haunted by a <b>recurring</b> image of their daughter on the night she died.</i>
<b>regular</b>	A regular member of the armed forces. <i>A <b>regular</b> morass of details.</i>
<b>regularity</b>	The state or quality of being regular. <i>He was famous for the <b>regularity</b> of his habits.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	In a regular manner. <i>Make a point of <b>regularly</b> consulting the noticeboard.</i>
<b>repeated</b>	Done or occurring again several times in the same way. <i>There were <b>repeated</b> attempts to negotiate.</i>
<b>triennial</b>	A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years. <i>The <b>triennial</b> meeting of the Association.</i>
<b><u>weekly</u></b>	Without missing a week. <i><b>Weekly</b> paper.</i>
<b><u>yearly</u></b>	Once a year or every year. <i>Rent was paid <b>yearly</b>.</i>
