
Perilous as an Adjective

- Full of danger or risk.
- Fraught with danger.







Synonyms of "Perilous" as an adjective (16 Words)

dangerous	Involving or causing danger or risk; liable to hurt or harm. A dangerous animal.
defenceless	Without defence or protection; totally vulnerable. Attacks on defenceless civilians.
exposed	With no protection or shield. <i>The venue featured beautiful hardwood floors and exposed brick <i>walls.</i></i>
fraught with dange	r Marked by distress.
hazardous	Involving risk or danger. It is hazardous to personal safety.
high-risk	Not financially safe or secure.
<u>insecure</u>	(of a person) uncertain or anxious about oneself; not confident. An insecure computer system.
life-threatening	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm.
parlous	Full of danger or uncertainty; precarious. The General s position was parlous .
<u>precarious</u>	Not secure; beset with difficulties. The precarious life of an undersea diver.
<u>risky</u>	Involving risk or danger. Extremely risky going out in the tide and fog.
touch-and-go	Functioning correctly and ready for action.
treacherous	Tending to betray especially having a treacherous character as attributed to the Carthaginians by the Romans. <i>The fiercest and most treacherous of foes.</i>
unsafe	Not safe; dangerous. Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe .
<u>unsound</u>	Physically unsound or diseased. Activities deemed to be environmentally unsound .
<u>vulnerable</u>	(of a partnership) liable to higher penalties, either by convention or through having won one game towards a rubber. <i>Vulnerable</i> to bribery.





Usage Examples of "Perilous" as an adjective

- A perilous voyage across the Atlantic in a small boat.
- The economy is in a perilous state.
- A perilous journey south.





Associations of "Perilous" (30 Words)

<u>crisis</u>	A crucial stage or turning point in the course of something. They went bankrupt during the economic crisis .
danger	A dangerous place. He feared the danger s of traveling by air.
dangerous	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. A dangerous operation.
deadly	Extremely. Deadly dull.
dicey	Of uncertain outcome; especially fraught with risk- New Yorker. <i>Democracy is a dicey business.</i>
<u>hazardous</u>	Risky; dangerous. We work in hazardous conditions.
incinerate	Cause to undergo combustion. <i>Waste packaging is to be</i> incinerate d rather than buried in landfills.
<u>insecure</u>	Not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way. An insecure footbridge.



<u>insidious</u>	Beguiling but harmful. <i>Insidious</i> pleasures.
irradiate	Expose (someone or something) to radiation. <i>Irradiate</i> food.
neurotoxin	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
parlous	Full of danger or uncertainty; precarious. She is parlous handsome.
peril	The dangers or difficulties that arise from a particular situation or activity. <i>The movement is in peril of dying.</i>
perilously	In a dangerous manner. Houses perched perilously on craggy outposts.
<u>pitfall</u>	An unforeseen or unexpected or surprising difficulty. The pitfall s of buying goods at public auctions.
<u>precarious</u>	Not securely held or in position; dangerously likely to fall or collapse. <i>A precarious ladder.</i>
radioactivity	The spontaneous emission of a stream of particles or electromagnetic rays in nuclear decay. An escape of radioactivity .
radium	The chemical element of atomic number 88, a rare radioactive metal of the alkaline earth series. It was formerly used as a source of radiation for radiotherapy.
risk	Take a risk in the hope of a favorable outcome. All risk s insurance for professional photographers.
<u>risky</u>	Full of the possibility of danger, failure, or loss. It was much too risky to try to disarm him.
<u>shaky</u>	Not secure; beset with difficulties. After a shaky start the Scottish team made superb efforts.
shivering	A sensation of cold that often marks the start of an infection and the development of a fever. Sparkling light from the shivering crystals of the chandelier.
spineless	Lacking thorns. <i>Spineless</i> forms of prickly pear have been selected.
stunt	Perform a stunt or stunts. Some weeds produce chemicals that stunt the plant s growth.
threatened	Likely in the near future to become endangered. The spotted owl is a threatened species not yet an endangered one.



toxicity	The degree to which something is poisonous. That was how I protected my partner from my family s toxicity .
unsafe	Not safe from attack. Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe .
volatility	Liability to change rapidly and unpredictably, especially for the worse. <i>A week of historic stock market volatility</i> .
<u>vulnerable</u>	Susceptible to attack. A vulnerable bridge.
weakly	Sickly; not robust. If the lambs were weakly we had to feed them by hand.





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
