<b>extend throughout</b>	Thrust or extend out.
<b>fill</b>	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>His presence <b>filled</b> us with foreboding.</i>
<b>filter</b>	Process or treat with a filter. <i>You'll be put through to a secretary whose job it is to <b>filter</b> calls.</i>
<b>filter through</b>	Remove by passing through a filter.
<b>flow through</b>	Fall or flow in a certain way.
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>impregnate</b>	Fertilize (an ovum). <i>An atmosphere <b>impregnated</b> with tension.</i>
<b><u>infiltrate</u></b>	Pass through an enemy line; in a military conflict. <i>Lignocaine was <b>infiltrated</b> into the wound.</i>
<b>inform</b>	Give incriminating information about someone to the police or other authority. <i>He had been recruited by the KGB to <b>inform</b> on his fellow students.</i>
<b>interpenetrate</b>	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. <i>Fibres of meaning <b>interpenetrate</b> every strand of sound.</i>
<b>leach through</b>	Permeate or penetrate gradually.
<b>pass through</b>	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
<b>percolate</b>	Spread gradually through an area or group of people. <i>It will have to be instant coffee there's no time to <b>percolate</b> any.</i>
<b>percolate through</b>	Pass through.
<b>perfuse</b>	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The yellow light is <b>perfused</b> with white.</i>
<b><u>pervade</u></b>	Be present and apparent throughout. <i>A smell of stale cabbage <b>pervaded</b> the air.</i>
<b>riddle</b>	Speak in riddles. <i><b>Riddle</b> me this then.</i>
<b>run through</b>	Be affected by; be subjected to.

<b>saturate</b>	Supply (a market) beyond the point at which the demand for a product is satisfied. <i>The soil is <b>saturated</b>.</i>
<b>seep through</b>	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings.
<b>sink in</b>	Fall heavily or suddenly; decline markedly.
<b>soak through</b>	Make drunk (with alcoholic drinks).
<b>spread through</b>	Become distributed or widespread.
<b>steep</b>	Devote (oneself) fully to. <i><b>Steep</b> the blossoms in oil.</i>
<b>suffuse</b>	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>Her cheeks were <b>suffused</b> with colour.</i>

<b>click</b>	Produce a click. <i>It s normal for a <b>click</b> to select an item.</i>
<b>diffuse</b>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to <b>diffuse</b> power without creating anarchy.</i>
<b>diffusion</b>	The action of spreading the light from a light source evenly to reduce glare and harsh shadows. <i>The <b>diffusion</b> of knowledge.</i>
<b>dispel</b>	Force to go away; used both with concrete and metaphoric meanings. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to <b>dispel</b> Elaine s dejection.</i>
<b>dispersed</b>	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely <b>dispersed</b> friends.</i>

<b>dispersion</b>	The extent to which values of a variable differ from a fixed value such as the mean. <i>The study looks at the <b>dispersion</b> of earnings with OECD member countries.</i>
<b>disseminate</b>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can <b>disseminate</b> and migrate.</i>
<b>dissemination</b>	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Waste or fritter away (money, energy, or resources). <i>No power is <b>dissipated</b> in this sort of control element.</i>
<b>filter</b>	Process or treat with a filter. <i>You ll be put through to a secretary whose job it is to <b>filter</b> calls.</i>
<b>growing</b>	The process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the <b>growing</b> child.</i>
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>infiltrate</b>	Cause (a liquid) to permeate something by filtration. <i>One of the tumours <b>infiltrated</b> the submucosa.</i>
<b>intersperse</b>	Introduce one's writing or speech with certain expressions. <i><b>Intersperse</b> exclamation marks in the text.</i>
<b>leach</b>	The process of leaching. <i>Pesticides and fertilizers that <b>leach</b> into rivers.</i>
<b>omnipresent</b>	(of God) present everywhere at the same time. <i>The <b>omnipresent</b> threat of natural disasters.</i>
<b>percolate</b>	Gain or regain energy. <i><b>Percolate</b> coffee.</i>
<b>perforate</b>	Perforated. <i>A <b>perforated</b> eardrum.</i>
<b>pervade</b>	(especially of a smell) spread through and be perceived in every part of. <i>The sense of crisis which <b>pervaded</b> Europe in the 1930s.</i>
<b>pierce</b>	Cut or make a way through. <i>A shrill voice <b>pierced</b> the air.</i>
<b>piercing</b>	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. <i><b>Piercing</b> knifelike pains.</i>

<b>porous</b>	Able to absorb fluids. <i>Layers of <b>porous</b> limestones.</i>
<b><u>scatter</u></b>	Sow by scattering. <i>His family are hoping to <b>scatter</b> his ashes at sea.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i><b>Scattered</b> thoughts.</i>
<b><u>seep</u></b>	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings. <i>Water began to <b>seep</b> through the soles of his boots.</i>
<b>spread</b>	The fact or process of spreading over an area. <i>The owls have <b>spread</b> as far north as Kuala Lumpur.</i>
<b>stick</b>	Stick to firmly. <i>He collected dry <b>sticks</b> for a campfire.</i>
<b>strew</b>	Scatter or spread (things) untidily over a surface or area. <i>Leaves <b>strewed</b> the path.</i>
