extend throughout	Thrust or extend out.
fill	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition no restriction. <i>His presence filled us with foreboding.</i>
filter	Process or treat with a filter. <i>You ll be put through to a secretary whose job it is to filter calls.</i>
filter through	Remove by passing through a filter.
flow through	Fall or flow in a certain way.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
impregnate	Fertilize (an ovum). <i>An atmosphere impregnated with tension.</i>
<u>infiltrate</u>	Pass through an enemy line; in a military conflict. <i>Lignocaine was infiltrated into the wound.</i>
inform	Give incriminating information about someone to the police or other authority. <i>He had been recruited by the KGB to inform on his fellow students.</i>
interpenetrate	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. <i>Fibres of meaning interpenetrate every strand of sound.</i>
leach through	Permeate or penetrate gradually.
pass through	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
percolate	Spread gradually through an area or group of people. <i>It will have to be instant coffee there s no time to percolate any.</i>
percolate through	Pass through.
perfuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The yellow light is perfused with white.</i>
<u>pervade</u>	Be present and apparent throughout. <i>A smell of stale cabbage pervaded the air.</i>
riddle	Speak in riddles. <i>Riddle me this then.</i>
run through	Be affected by; be subjected to.

saturate	Supply (a market) beyond the point at which the demand for a product is satisfied. <i>The soil is saturated.</i>
seep through	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings.
sink in	Fall heavily or suddenly; decline markedly.
soak through	Make drunk (with alcoholic drinks).
spread through	Become distributed or widespread.
steep	Devote (oneself) fully to. <i>Steep the blossoms in oil.</i>
suffuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>Her cheeks were suffused with colour.</i>

- *The aroma of soup permeated the air.*
- *His personality has begun to permeate through the whole organization.*
- *An atmosphere of distrust has permeated this administration.*

click	Produce a click. <i>It s normal for a click to select an item.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to diffuse power without creating anarchy.</i>
diffusion	The action of spreading the light from a light source evenly to reduce glare and harsh shadows. <i>The diffusion of knowledge.</i>
dispel	Force to go away; used both with concrete and metaphoric meanings. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine s dejection.</i>
dispersed	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.</i>

<u>dispersion</u>	The extent to which values of a variable differ from a fixed value such as the mean. <i>The study looks at the dispersion of earnings with OECD member countries.</i>
<u>disseminate</u>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
dissipate	Waste or fritter away (money, energy, or resources). <i>No power is dissipated in this sort of control element.</i>
filter	Process or treat with a filter. <i>You ll be put through to a secretary whose job it is to filter calls.</i>
growing	The process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the growing child.</i>
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<u>infiltrate</u>	Cause (a liquid) to permeate something by filtration. <i>One of the tumours infiltrated the submucosa.</i>
intersperse	Introduce one's writing or speech with certain expressions. <i>Intersperse exclamation marks in the text.</i>
leach	The process of leaching. <i>Pesticides and fertilizers that leach into rivers.</i>
<u>omnipresent</u>	(of God) present everywhere at the same time. <i>The omnipresent threat of natural disasters.</i>
percolate	Gain or regain energy. <i>Percolate coffee.</i>
perforate	Perforated. <i>A perforated eardrum.</i>
<u>pervade</u>	(especially of a smell) spread through and be perceived in every part of. <i>The sense of crisis which pervaded Europe in the 1930s.</i>
<u>pierce</u>	Cut or make a way through. <i>A shrill voice pierced the air.</i>
<u>piercing</u>	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. <i>Piercing knifelike pains.</i>

porous	Able to absorb fluids. <i>Layers of porous limestones.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	Sow by scattering. <i>His family are hoping to scatter his ashes at sea.</i>
scattered	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>Scattered thoughts.</i>
<u>seep</u>	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings. <i>Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.</i>
spread	The fact or process of spreading over an area. <i>The owls have spread as far north as Kuala Lumpur.</i>
stick	Stick to firmly. <i>He collected dry sticks for a campfire.</i>
strew	Scatter or spread (things) untidily over a surface or area. <i>Leaves strewed the path.</i>
