
Pernicious as an Adjective

detrimental (sometimes followed by `to') causing harm or injury.

Recent policies have been **detrimental** to the interests of many old people.

evil Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil.

An **evil** influence.

fatal Causing death.

Such doctrines if true would be absolutely **fatal** to my theory.

harmful Causing or likely to cause harm.

Sugars which can be **harmful** to the teeth.

hurtful Causing distress to someone's feelings.

His **hurtful** remarks.

inimical Tending to obstruct or harm.

An **inimical** critic.

injurious Harmful to living things.

Food which is **injurious** to health.

Proceeding in a gradual, subtle way, but with very harmful effects.

Insidious pleasures.

lethal Very harmful or destructive.

The Krakatoa eruption was the most **lethal** on record.

malevolent Having or exerting a malignant influence.

The glint of dark **malevolent** eyes.

malign Of a disease malignant.

Prompted by **malign** motives.

(of a tumour) tending to invade normal tissue or to recur after removal;

malignant cancerous.

In the hands of **malignant** fate.

noxious Injurious to physical or mental health.

Noxious chemical wastes.



pestilent Destructive to life; deadly.

A **pestilent**ial malignancy in the air.

poisonous Marked by deep ill will; deliberately harmful.

Poisonous chemicals.

ruinous Costing far more than can be afforded.

A **ruinous** effect on the environment.

Making use of clever and indirect methods to achieve something.

Subtle lighting.

unfavourable Likely to lead to an adverse outcome.
