Synonyms of "Perpetrator" as a noun (1 Word)

culprit Someone who perpetrates wrongdoing. *The car s front nearside door had been smashed in but the culprits had fled.*

Usage Examples of "Perpetrator" as a noun

• The perpetrators of this horrific crime must be brought to justice.

Associations of "Perpetrator" (30 Words)

apprehend Arrest (someone) for a crime. We enter a field of vision we could not otherwise **apprehend**.



<u>captive</u>	A person who has been taken prisoner or an animal that has been confined. <i>The farm was used to hold prisoners of war captive.</i>
capture	A person or thing that has been captured. <i>The capture of the city.</i>
catch	Dismiss a batsman by catching the ball before it touches the ground. I didn t catch your name.
committal	The burial of a dead body. The high level of committal s.
<u>convict</u>	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. Two escaped convict s kidnapped them at gunpoint.
<u>conviction</u>	A final judgment of guilty in a criminal case and the punishment that is imposed. His conviction that the death was no accident was stronger.
criminal	Relating to crime as opposed to civil matters. <i>Criminal</i> in the sight of God and man.
crook	A circular segment of a curve. He crook ed a finger for the waitress.
<u>culprit</u>	The cause of a problem or defect. Low level ozone pollution is the real culprit .
<u>delinquent</u>	A delinquent person. A delinquent account.
felon	A person who has committed a felony. The felon undermining hand of dark corruption.
gang	Of a number of people form a group or gang. They gang ed up on me and nicked my pocket money.
guilty	Justly chargeable with a particular fault or error. A guilty look.
<u>imprisonment</u>	The act of confining someone in a prison (or as if in a prison. The imprisonment of captured soldiers.
incarcerate	Lock up or confine, in or as in a jail. The murderer was incarcerate d for the rest of his life.
indictment	A formal document written for a prosecuting attorney charging a person with some offense. <i>These rapidly escalating crime figures are an</i> indictment of our society.
inmate	One of several occupants of a house. <i>Inmates of the Louisiana State Penitentiary.</i>



intern	Serve as an intern. The young doctor is intern ing at the Medical Center this year.
jail	Lock up or confine in or as in a jail. The driver was jail ed for two years.
<u>murderer</u>	A criminal who commits homicide (who performs the unlawful premeditated killing of another human being. <i>Convicted murderers.</i>
offender	A person who transgresses moral or civil law. You can t get away from sex these days and the TV is the worst offender .
<u>outlaw</u>	Declare illegal outlaw. An outlaw strike.
parole	Release a criminal from detention and place him on parole. A good many French officers had been living on parole in Melrose.
penitential	Relating to or expressing penitence or penance. Wrote a penitential letter apologizing for her hasty words.
penitentiary	A prison for people convicted of serious crimes. Penitentiary institutions.
<u>prison</u>	Imprison. He died in prison .
<u>prisoner</u>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. A prisoner serving a life sentence.
<u>sinner</u>	A person who transgresses against divine law by committing an immoral act or acts. God forgives repentant sinner s.
theft	The act of taking something from someone unlawfully. The latest theft happened at a garage.
