### Definitions of "Perpetuate" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “perpetuate” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Make (something) continue indefinitely.*
- *Cause to continue or prevail.*



## Synonyms of "Perpetuate" as a verb (13 Words)

- carry on** Have on the surface or on the skin.
- cause to continue** Give rise to; cause to happen or occur, not always intentionally.
- conserve** Use cautiously and frugally.  
*The adjacent sequence is **conserved** over large evolutionary distances.*
- continue** Continue in a place position or situation.  
*The case was **continued** without a finding until August 2.*
- extend** Thrust or extend out.  
*The war **extended** over five years.*
- keep alive** Prevent (food) from rotting.
- keep going** Maintain by writing regular records.

<b>keep in existence</b>	Maintain in safety from injury, harm, or danger.
<b>keep up</b>	Hold and prevent from leaving.
<b>maintain</b>	Maintain for use and service. <i>An English garrison was <b>maintained</b> there in the seventeenth century.</i>
<b><u>preserve</u></b>	To keep up and reserve for personal or special use. <i>The film has <b>preserved</b> all the qualities of the novel.</i>
<b><u>prolong</u></b>	Extend the duration of. <i><b>Prolong</b> the treatment of the patient.</i>
<b><u>sustain</u></b>	Be the physical support of; carry the weight of. <i>The allegations of discrimination were <b>sustained</b>.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Perpetuate" as a verb

- *The confusion was perpetuated through inadvertence.*
- *Perpetuate a myth.*
- *A monument to perpetuate the memory of those killed in the war.*



## Associations of "Perpetuate" (30 Words)

### ceaseless

Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.  
*The fort was subjected to **ceaseless** bombardment.*

### changeless

Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature.  
***Changeless** truths.*

### constant

Occurring continuously over a period of time.  
*The condition of struggle remained a **constant**.*

<b><u>continuation</u></b>	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that there is an innate tendency to perceive a line as continuing its established direction. <i>Once a separate village it is now a <b>continuation</b> of the suburbs.</i>
<b>endless</b>	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. <i>An <b>endless</b> chain.</i>
<b><u>epitomize</u></b>	Embody the essential characteristics of or be a typical example of. <i>For the benefit of our readers we will <b>epitomize</b> the pamphlet.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	(of truths, values, or questions) valid for all time; essentially unchanging. <i><b>Eternal</b> truths.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Life <b>everlasting</b>.</i>
<b><u>extend</u></b>	Stretch out over a distance space time or scope run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point. <i><b>Extend</b> my greetings.</i>
<b><u>extension</u></b>	A subsidiary telephone on the same line as the main one. <i>Direct marketing is an <b>extension</b> of telephone selling.</i>
<b><u>forever</u></b>	Lasting or permanent. <i>They are <b>forever</b> on the move.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>indelible</b>	Cannot be removed or erased. <i>An <b>indelible</b> marker pen.</i>
<b><u>inequality</u></b>	A symbolic expression of the fact that two quantities are not equal. <i>Social <b>inequality</b>.</i>
<b>intension</b>	The internal content of a concept.
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b><u>long</u></b>	Long dated securities especially gilts. <i>A <b>long</b> road.</i>
<b>memory</b>	The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes. <i>He can do it from <b>memory</b>.</i>
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <i><b>Permanent</b> address.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Never ending or changing. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.</i>



<b>perpetually</b>	Everlastingly; for all time- Stuart Chase. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>perpetuation</b>	The act of prolonging something. <i>We criticized the <b>perpetuation</b> of racial stereotypes.</i>
<b>perpetuity</b>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
<b>poverty</b>	The state of having little or no money and few or no material possessions. <i>Thousands of families are living in abject <b>poverty</b>.</i>
<b>preservation</b>	An occurrence of improvement by virtue of preventing loss or injury or other change. <i>The <b>preservation</b> of the city's green spaces.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	Amount or degree or range to which something extends. <i>There was an indefinite <b>prolongation</b> of the peace talks.</i>
<b>reminder</b>	Someone who gives a warning so that a mistake can be avoided. <i>Her mushroom omelette is a blissful <b>reminder</b> of Sunday suppers.</i>
<b>stereotype</b>	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. <i>Regional <b>stereotypes</b> have been part of America since its founding.</i>
<b>timeless</b>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the <b>timeless</b> atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
