- Cause to continue or prevail.






# Synonyms of "Perpetuate" as a verb (13 Words)

carry on	Have on the surface or on the skin.
cause to continue	Give rise to; cause to happen or occur, not always intentionally.
<u>conserve</u>	Use cautiously and frugally. The adjacent sequence is <b>conserve</b> d over large evolutionary distances
continue	Continue in a place position or situation. <i>The case was <b>continue</b>d without a finding until August 2.</i>
<u>extend</u>	Thrust or extend out. The war <b>extend</b> ed over five years.
keep alive	Prevent (food) from rotting.
keep going	Maintain by writing regular records.



keep in existence	Maintain in safety from injury, harm, or danger.
keep up	Hold and prevent from leaving.
maintain	Maintain for use and service. An English garrison was <b>maintain</b> ed there in the seventeenth century.
<u>preserve</u>	To keep up and reserve for personal or special use. The film has <b>preserve</b> d all the qualities of the novel.
<u>prolong</u>	Extend the duration of. <b>Prolong</b> the treatment of the patient.
<u>sustain</u>	Be the physical support of; carry the weight of. The allegations of discrimination were <b>sustain</b> ed.

- The confusion was perpetuated through inadvertence.
- Perpetuate a myth.
- A monument to perpetuate the memory of those killed in the war.



## Associations of "Perpetuate" (30 Words)

<u>ceaseless</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. The fort was subjected to <b>ceaseless</b> bombardment.
changeless	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
constant	Occurring continuously over a period of time. The condition of struggle remained a <b>constant</b> .



<u>continuation</u>	A Gestalt principle of organization holding that there is an innate tendency to perceive a line as continuing its established direction. <i>Once a separate village it is now a <b>continuation</b> of the suburbs.</i>
endless	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. An <b>endless</b> chain.
<u>epitomize</u>	Embody the essential characteristics of or be a typical example of. For the benefit of our readers we will <b>epitomize</b> the pamphlet.
<u>eternal</u>	(of truths, values, or questions) valid for all time; essentially unchanging. <i>Eternal</i> truths.
everlasting	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Life <b>everlasting</b>.</i>
<u>extend</u>	Stretch out over a distance space time or scope run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point. <i>Extend</i> my greetings.
<u>extension</u>	A subsidiary telephone on the same line as the main one. Direct marketing is an <b>extension</b> of telephone selling.
<u>forever</u>	Lasting or permanent. They are <b>forever</b> on the move.
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.
indelible	Cannot be removed or erased. An <b>indelible</b> marker pen.
<u>inequality</u>	A symbolic expression of the fact that two quantities are not equal. Social <b>inequality</b> .
intension	The internal content of a concept.
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.
<u>long</u>	Long dated securities especially gilts. A <b>long</b> road.
memory	The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes. <i>He can do it from <b>memory</b></i> .
<u>permanent</u>	A series of waves in the hair made by applying heat and chemicals. <b>Permanent</b> address.
perpetual	Never ending or changing. A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.



perpetually	Everlastingly; for all time- Stuart Chase. She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.
perpetuation	The act of prolonging something. We criticized the <b>perpetuation</b> of racial stereotypes.
<u>perpetuity</u>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless. <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
poverty	The state of having little or no money and few or no material possessions. Thousands of families are living in abject <b>poverty</b> .
preservation	An occurrence of improvement by virtue of preventing loss or injury or other change. The <b>preservation</b> of the city s green spaces.
prolongation	Amount or degree or range to which something extends. There was an indefinite <b>prolongation</b> of the peace talks.
reminder	Someone who gives a warning so that a mistake can be avoided. <i>Her mushroom omelette is a blissful <b>reminder</b> of Sunday suppers.</i>
stereotype	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. <i>Regional <b>stereotype</b>s have been part of America since its founding.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. Antiques add to the <b>timeless</b> atmosphere of the dining room.
unceasing	Continuing forever or indefinitely. The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.
