extension	Permission granted to licensed premises for the sale of alcoholic drinks until later than usual. <i>They applied for an extension of the loan.</i>
forever	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>It took forever to get a passport.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>

indelible	(of ink or a pen) making marks that cannot be removed. <i>Indelible memories.</i>
inequality	A symbolic expression of the fact that two quantities are not equal. <i>The growing inequality between rich and poor.</i>
intension	Resolution or determination.
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
long	Of elongated shape. <i>A long time.</i>
memory	An electronic memory device. <i>The worst slump in recent memory.</i>
permanent	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i>Permanent secretary to the president.</i>
perpetual	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>A perpetual bond.</i>
perpetually	Without interruption. <i>Perpetually hungry teenage boys.</i>
perpetuation	The act of prolonging something. <i>Perpetuation of the species is our purpose.</i>
perpetuity	The state or quality of lasting forever. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
poverty	The state of being inferior in quality or insufficient in amount. <i>Thousands of families are living in abject poverty.</i>
preservation	The activity of protecting something from loss or danger. <i>The chapel is in a poor state of preservation.</i>
prolongation	Extension of the spatial length of something. <i>An agreement on further prolongation of the boundary proved difficult.</i>
reminder	A letter sent to remind someone of an obligation, especially to pay a bill. <i>He ignored his wife's reminders.</i>
stereotype	Treat or classify according to a mental stereotype. <i>The stereotype of the woman as the carer.</i>
timeless	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
unceasing	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
