<a href="#">ceaseless</a>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The fort was subjected to <b>ceaseless</b> bombardment.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A quantity that does not vary. <i>A man <b>constant</b> in adherence to his ideals.</i>
<a href="#">continuation</a>	A part that is attached to and is an extension of something else. <i>The government s <b>continuation</b> in office.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i>Time is <b>endless</b>.</i>
<a href="#">epitomize</a>	Be a perfect example of. <i>The company <b>epitomized</b> the problems faced by British industry.</i>
<a href="#">eternal</a>	Used to refer to an everlasting or universal spirit, as represented by God. <i>The wait seemed <b>eternal</b>.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Life <b>everlasting</b>.</i>
<a href="#">extend</a>	Extend in scope or range or area. <i><b>Extend</b> my greetings.</i>
<a href="#">extension</a>	A room or rooms added to an existing building. <i>Nature for Descartes was pure <b>extension</b> in space.</i>
<a href="#">forever</a>	Without interruption. <i>Parenting is a <b>forever</b> job.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>indelible</b>	Not able to be forgotten. <i>An <b>indelible</b> marker pen.</i>

<b>inequality</b>	Lack of smoothness or regularity in a surface. <i>Social <b>inequality</b>.</i>
<b>intension</b>	Resolution or determination.
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>long</b>	Of elongated shape. <i>An hour <b>long</b>.</i>
<b>memory</b>	The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes. <i>The module provides 16Mb of <b>memory</b>.</i>
<b>permanent</b>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>A woman with a home <b>permanent</b>.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>He grows <b>perpetual</b> flowering carnations.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Without interruption. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>perpetuation</b>	The act of prolonging something. <i>We criticized the <b>perpetuation</b> of racial stereotypes.</i>
<b>perpetuity</b>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
<b>poverty</b>	The state of being extremely poor. <i>Thousands of families are living in abject <b>poverty</b>.</i>
<b>preservation</b>	The action of preserving something. <i>The <b>preservation</b> of the city's green spaces.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	Extension of the spatial length of something. <i>An agreement on further <b>prolongation</b> of the boundary proved difficult.</i>
<b>reminder</b>	A letter sent to remind someone of an obligation, especially to pay a bill. <i>One man was threatened with court action for not paying his water rates when he did not receive a <b>reminder</b>.</i>
<b>stereotype</b>	View or represent as a stereotype. <i>I was <b>stereotyped</b> as a lazy Southern European.</i>
<b>timeless</b>	Unaffected by time. <i>Helen's <b>timeless</b> beauty.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
