extend	Stretch out over a distance space time or scope run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point. <i>Extend the casserole with a little rice.</i>
extension	The spreading of something (a belief or practice) into new regions. <i>A postgraduate extension course.</i>
forever	Without interruption. <i>Parenting is a forever job.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>

indelible	Not able to be forgotten. <i>An indelible stain.</i>
inequality	Lack of smoothness or regularity in a surface. <i>The growing inequality between rich and poor.</i>
intension	What you must know in order to determine the reference of an expression.
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
long	A long period. <i>A long and distinguished career.</i>
memory	An electronic memory device. <i>He taught a graduate course on learning and memory.</i>
permanent	Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place. <i>Permanent brain damage.</i>
perpetual	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
perpetually	Everlastingly; for all time- Stuart Chase. <i>Perpetually hungry teenage boys.</i>
perpetuation	The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc. <i>We criticized the perpetuation of racial stereotypes.</i>
perpetuity	A bond or other security with no fixed maturity date. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
poverty	The state of being inferior in quality or insufficient in amount. <i>Thousands of families are living in abject poverty.</i>
preservation	The state of being preserved, especially to a specified degree. <i>Food preservation.</i>
prolongation	The act of prolonging something. <i>There was an indefinite prolongation of the peace talks.</i>
reminder	Someone who gives a warning so that a mistake can be avoided. <i>He ignored his wife s reminders.</i>
stereotype	View or represent as a stereotype. <i>Don t treat anyone as a stereotype.</i>
timeless	Unaffected by time. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
