- *The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless).*
- *The state or quality of lasting forever.*
- *A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law.*

changelessness	The quality of being unchangeable; having a marked tendency to remain unchanged.
constancy	The quality of being faithful and dependable. <i>Early mariners relied on the constancy of the trade winds.</i>
continuance	A postponement or an adjournment. <i>The trademarks shall be used only during the continuance of this agreement.</i>
continuity	The maintenance of continuous action and self-consistent detail in the various scenes of a film or broadcast. <i>The BBC continuity announcer.</i>
<u>dependability</u>	The quality of being trustworthy and reliable. <i>The brand has built its reputation on rock solid dependability.</i>
durability	Permanence by virtue of the power to resist stress or force. <i>They advertised the durability of their products.</i>
endlessness	The property of being (or seeming to be) without end.
<u>endurance</u>	The ability to endure an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way. <i>The marathon tests a runner's endurance.</i>
fixedness	The quality of being fixed in place as by some firm attachment. <i>The fixedness of his gaze upset her.</i>
fixity	The quality of being incapable of mutation. <i>The fixity of his stare.</i>
immortality	The quality of deserving to be remembered for a long time; timelessness. <i>Occasionally a guide book has achieved immortality.</i>
immutability	The quality of being incapable of mutation.
indestructibility	The strength to resist destruction.
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
persistence	Persistent determination. <i>The persistence of huge environmental problems.</i>
sempiternity	Assembly possessing high legislative powers.
<u>stability</u>	The state of being stable. <i>There are fears for the political stability of the area.</i>

- ceaseless** Constant and unending.
*The fort was subjected to **ceaseless** bombardment.*
- changeless** Unvarying in nature.
***Changeless** truths.*
- constant** A number expressing a relation or property which remains the same in all circumstances, or for the same substance under the same conditions.
*A **constant** friend.*
- continual** Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption.
*His plane went down after **continual** attacks.*

<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>This information is continually updated.</i>
continue	Continue in a place position or situation. <i>She continued as deputy mayor for another year.</i>
continuous	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. <i>A continuous line has no gaps or breaks in it.</i>
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
endless	Having the ends united so as to form a continuous whole. <i>Endless waves.</i>
<u>enduring</u>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Eternal truths of art and life.</i>
eternity	Infinite or unending time. <i>He could have crashed the car and taken them both to eternity.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>They felt better than ever before.</i>
everlasting	A flower of the daisy family with a papery texture, retaining its shape and colour after being dried, especially a helichrysum. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>
<u>forever</u>	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>Parenting is a forever job.</i>
<u>grinding</u>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>The roasting and grinding of grain usually barley for use in brewing.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Our mortal bodies are inhabited by immortal souls.</i>
immortalize	Confer enduring fame upon. <i>He will be forever immortalized in the history books.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>God s infinite wisdom.</i>

interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
<u>permanent</u>	Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place. <i>A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
unceasing	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
uninterrupted	Without a break in continuity. <i>The window gives an uninterrupted view of the mountains.</i>
unlimited	Not limited or restricted in terms of number, quantity, or extent. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting drizzle.</i>
