- *The state or quality of lasting forever.*
- *A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law.*

<b>changelessness</b>	The quality of being unchangeable; having a marked tendency to remain unchanged.
<b>constancy</b>	The quality of being faithful and dependable. <i>Early mariners relied on the <b>constancy</b> of the trade winds.</i>
<b>continuance</b>	A postponement or an adjournment. <i>The trademarks shall be used only during the <b>continuance</b> of this agreement.</i>
<b>continuity</b>	The maintenance of continuous action and self-consistent detail in the various scenes of a film or broadcast. <i>The BBC <b>continuity</b> announcer.</i>
<a href="#"><u>dependability</u></a>	The quality of being trustworthy and reliable. <i>The brand has built its reputation on rock solid <b>dependability</b>.</i>
<b>durability</b>	Permanence by virtue of the power to resist stress or force. <i>They advertised the <b>durability</b> of their products.</i>
<b>endlessness</b>	The property of being (or seeming to be) without end.
<a href="#"><u>endurance</u></a>	The ability to endure an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way. <i>The marathon tests a runner's <b>endurance</b>.</i>
<b>fixedness</b>	The quality of being fixed in place as by some firm attachment. <i>The <b>fixedness</b> of his gaze upset her.</i>
<b>fixity</b>	The quality of being incapable of mutation. <i>The <b>fixity</b> of his stare.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	The quality of deserving to be remembered for a long time; timelessness. <i>Occasionally a guide book has achieved <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>immutability</b>	The quality of being incapable of mutation.
<b>indestructibility</b>	The strength to resist destruction.
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b>persistence</b>	Persistent determination. <i>The <b>persistence</b> of huge environmental problems.</i>
<b>sempiternity</b>	Assembly possessing high legislative powers.
<a href="#"><u>stability</u></a>	The state of being stable. <i>There are fears for the political <b>stability</b> of the area.</i>

- ceaseless** Constant and unending.  
*The fort was subjected to **ceaseless** bombardment.*
- changeless** Unvarying in nature.  
***Changeless** truths.*
- constant** A number expressing a relation or property which remains the same in all circumstances, or for the same substance under the same conditions.  
*A **constant** friend.*
- continual** Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption.  
*His plane went down after **continual** attacks.*

<b><u>continually</u></b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>This information is <b>continually</b> updated.</i>
<b>continue</b>	Continue in a place position or situation. <i>She <b>continued</b> as deputy mayor for another year.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. <i>A <b>continuous</b> line has no gaps or breaks in it.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having the ends united so as to form a continuous whole. <i><b>Endless</b> waves.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i><b>Eternal</b> truths of art and life.</i>
<b>eternity</b>	Infinite or unending time. <i>He could have crashed the car and taken them both to <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>They felt better than <b>ever</b> before.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	A flower of the daisy family with a papery texture, retaining its shape and colour after being dried, especially a helichrysum. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>
<b><u>forever</u></b>	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>Parenting is a <b>forever</b> job.</i>
<b><u>grinding</u></b>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>The roasting and <b>grinding</b> of grain usually barley for use in brewing.</i>
<b><u>immortal</u></b>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Our mortal bodies are inhabited by <b>immortal</b> souls.</i>
<b>immortalize</b>	Confer enduring fame upon. <i>He will be forever <b>immortalized</b> in the history books.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b><u>infinite</u></b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>God s <b>infinite</b> wisdom.</i>

<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place. <i>A <b>permanent</b> ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Never ending or changing. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b><u>timeless</u></b>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the <b>timeless</b> atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>Man s <b>unceasing</b> warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>uninterrupted</b>	Without a break in continuity. <i>The window gives an <b>uninterrupted</b> view of the mountains.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	Not limited or restricted in terms of number, quantity, or extent. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
<b><u>unremitting</u></b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i><b>Unremitting</b> drizzle.</i>
