## Associations of "Perplexed" (30 Words)

<b>aghast</b>	Filled with horror or shock. <i>She winced <b>aghast</b> at his cruelty.</i>
<b><u>alarmed</u></b>	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
<b><u>amaze</u></b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>Your ability to speak six languages <b>amazes</b> me.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Cause to be confused emotionally. <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b><u>bemused</u></b>	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i>Her <b>bemused</b> expression.</i>
<b><u>bewilder</u></b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>His reaction had <b>bewildered</b> her.</i>
<b>bewildered</b>	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i><b>Bewildered</b> and confused.</i>
<b><u>complicated</u></b>	Involving complications. <i><b>Complicated</b> appendicitis.</i>
<b>confound</b>	Mix up (something) with something else. <i>The rise in prices <b>confounded</b> expectations.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>A <b>confused</b> expression crossed her face.</i>
<b>confusing</b>	Causing confusion or disorientation. <i>Sent <b>confusing</b> signals to Iraq.</i>
<b><u>discombobulated</u></b>	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion- G.B.Shaw. <i>The hecklers pelted the <b>discombobulated</b> speaker with anything that came to hand.</i>

<b>disconcerted</b>	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion. <i>Looked at each other dumbly quite <b>disconcerted</b>.</i>
<b>dismayed</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b>disordered</b>	Suffering from an illness or condition that disrupts normal physical or mental functions. <i>She went to comb her <b>disordered</b> hair.</i>
<b>disorganized</b>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>The campaign was hopelessly <b>disorganized</b>.</i>
<b>disorient</b>	Cause someone to lose their sense of direction disorientate. <i>The driving snow <b>disoriented</b> them.</i>
<b>illusive</b>	Deceptive; illusory. <i>An <b>illusive</b> haven.</i>
<b>loon</b>	A worthless lazy fellow. <i>If only she weren't such a lovesick <b>loon</b>.</i>
<b>lost</b>	Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity. <i>A <b>lost</b> child.</i>
<b>melee</b>	A confused crowd of people. <i>The <b>melee</b> of people that were always thronging the streets.</i>
<b>mistakenly</b>	In a mistaken or erroneous manner. <i>They <b>mistakenly</b> believed her to be pregnant.</i>
<b>perplexing</b>	Completely baffling; very puzzling. <i>A <b>perplexing</b> problem.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i><b>Puzzled</b> that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
<b>puzzling</b>	Causing one to be puzzled; perplexing. <i>A <b>puzzling</b> statement.</i>
<b>questioning</b>	Showing curiosity. <i>The <b>questioning</b> mind of a child.</i>
<b>quizzical</b>	Playfully vexing (especially by ridicule). <i>He had a <b>quizzical</b> expression.</i>
<b>shocked</b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b>stuck</b>	Caught or fixed. <i>This problem has me completely <b>stuck</b>.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Feeling or showing surprise. <i><b>Surprised</b> that he remembered my name.</i>
