die hard	To be on base at the end of an inning, of a player.
<u>endure</u>	Suffer (something painful or difficult) patiently. <i>It seemed impossible that anyone could endure such pain.</i>
hang in	Suspend (meat) in order to get a gamey taste.
hang on	Decorate or furnish with something suspended.
hold on	Organize or be responsible for.
persevere	Be persistent, refuse to stop. His family persevere d with his treatment.
<u>prevail</u>	Be widespread or current in a particular area or at a particular time. She was prevail ed upon to give an account of her work.
<u>remain</u>	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i>He had remained alert the whole time.</i>



run	Be operating running or functioning. Run a new program on the Mac.
stay	Fasten with stays. It did not matter to you whether the building was stay ed up or not.








Usage Examples of "Persists" as a verb

continue	Continue after an interruption. She continue d as deputy mayor for another year.
continuity	A connection or line of development with no sharp breaks. They have provided the country with a measure of continuity .
<u>endurance</u>	The ability to endure an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way. <i>She was close to the limit of her endurance.</i>
<u>endure</u>	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant. <i>The legend of Elvis endures.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.
forbear	A person from whom you are descended. <i>She could not forbear weeping.</i>
<u>lag</u>	Cover with lagging to prevent heat loss. A time lag between infection and symptoms.
<u>linger</u>	Spend a long time over (something. <i>Her perfume lingered on.</i>
onwards	In a forward direction.
patience	Any of various forms of card game for one player, the object of which is to use up all one's cards by forming particular arrangements and sequences. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
patiently	With patience; in a patient manner. The assembled hordes waited patiently to get in.
persevere	Be persistent, refuse to stop. His family persevere d with his treatment.
persistence	The continued or prolonged existence of something. <i>Cardiff s persistence</i> was rewarded with a try.
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
<u>remain</u>	Stay the same remain in a certain state. Her husband remain ed at the flat in Regent s Park.
<u>reside</u>	Be inherent or innate in. She reside s in Princeton.
sojourn	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest. <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i>



stay	A period of staying somewhere in particular of living somewhere temporarily as a visitor or guest. Some men are always great at beginnings but they have no stay in them.
still	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. A still wine.
<u>survive</u>	Manage to keep going in difficult circumstances. <i>He survive</i> d the cancer against all odds.
tarry	Like or covered with tar. A length of tarry rope.
<u>tenacity</u>	The quality or fact of continuing to exist; persistence. <i>The sheer tenacity of the limpet.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Unaffected by time. <i>Helen s timeless beauty.</i>
toleration	The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour. All people should practice toleration and live together in peace.
unaltered	Remaining in an original state. Many buildings survive unaltered .
undaunted	Unshaken in purpose. Undaunted in the face of death.
wait	Serve as a waiter or waitress in a restaurant. I can t wait to tell Nick what happened.
withstand	Offer strong resistance or opposition to. The new material withstand s even the greatest wear and tear.
