Definitions of "Persists" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “persists” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Stay behind.*
- *Be persistent, refuse to stop.*
- *Continue to exist.*



Synonyms of "Persists" as a verb (10 Words)

- die hard** To be on base at the end of an inning, of a player.
- endure** Suffer (something painful or difficult) patiently.
*It seemed impossible that anyone could **endure** such pain.*
- hang in** Suspend (meat) in order to get a gamey taste.
- hang on** Decorate or furnish with something suspended.
- hold on** Organize or be responsible for.
- persevere** Be persistent, refuse to stop.
*His family **persevered** with his treatment.*
- prevail** Be widespread or current in a particular area or at a particular time.
*She was **prevailed** upon to give an account of her work.*
- remain** Stay the same remain in a certain state.
*He had **remained** alert the whole time.*

run Be operating running or functioning.
Run a new program on the Mac.

stay Fasten with stays.
It did not matter to you whether the building was **stayed** up or not.



Usage Examples of "Persists" as a verb

- *The child persisted and kept asking questions.*
- *He persisted to call me every night.*



Associations of "Persists" (30 Words)

- bear** Bring forth.
*The bees form large colonies and need the thick branches of tall trees to **bear** the weight of their nests.*
- consistent** Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts.
*The parents are being **consistent** and firm in their reactions.*

continue	Continue after an interruption. <i>She continued as deputy mayor for another year.</i>
continuity	A connection or line of development with no sharp breaks. <i>They have provided the country with a measure of continuity.</i>
endurance	The ability to endure an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way. <i>She was close to the limit of her endurance.</i>
endure	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant. <i>The legend of Elvis endures.</i>
flophouse	A cheap lodging house. <i>They are living in a flophouse and discovering that the streets are not paved with gold.</i>
forbear	A person from whom you are descended. <i>She could not forbear weeping.</i>
lag	Cover with lagging to prevent heat loss. <i>A time lag between infection and symptoms.</i>
linger	Spend a long time over (something). <i>Her perfume lingered on.</i>
onwards	In a forward direction.
patience	Any of various forms of card game for one player, the object of which is to use up all one's cards by forming particular arrangements and sequences. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
patiently	With patience; in a patient manner. <i>The assembled hordes waited patiently to get in.</i>
persevere	Be persistent, refuse to stop. <i>His family persevered with his treatment.</i>
persistence	The continued or prolonged existence of something. <i>Cardiff's persistence was rewarded with a try.</i>
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
remain	Stay the same remain in a certain state. <i>Her husband remained at the flat in Regent s Park.</i>
reside	Be inherent or innate in. <i>She resides in Princeton.</i>
sojourn	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest). <i>Her sojourn in Rome.</i>

stay	A period of staying somewhere in particular of living somewhere temporarily as a visitor or guest. <i>Some men are always great at beginnings but they have no stay in them.</i>
still	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. <i>A still wine.</i>
<u>survive</u>	Manage to keep going in difficult circumstances. <i>He survived the cancer against all odds.</i>
tarry	Like or covered with tar. <i>A length of tarry rope.</i>
<u>tenacity</u>	The quality or fact of continuing to exist; persistence. <i>The sheer tenacity of the limpet.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Unaffected by time. <i>Helen s timeless beauty.</i>
toleration	The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour. <i>All people should practice toleration and live together in peace.</i>
unaltered	Remaining in an original state. <i>Many buildings survive unaltered.</i>
undaunted	Unshaken in purpose. <i>Undaunted in the face of death.</i>
wait	Serve as a waiter or waitress in a restaurant. <i>I can t wait to tell Nick what happened.</i>
<u>withstand</u>	Offer strong resistance or opposition to. <i>The new material withstands even the greatest wear and tear.</i>
