hang in Suspend (meat) in order to get a gamey taste.hang on Decorate or furnish with something suspended.

hold on Organize or be responsible for.

persevere Be persistent, refuse to stop.

His family **persevere**d with his treatment.

Be widespread or current in a particular area or at a particular time.

She was **prevail**ed upon to give an account of her work.

remain Stay the same remain in a certain state. He had **remain**ed alert the whole time.



Be operating running or functioning. **Run** a new program on the Mac. run

Fasten with stays.

stay It did not matter to you whether the building was **stay**ed up or not.

- The child persisted and kept asking questions.
- He persisted to call me every night.
