- *As a person.*
- *As yourself.*
- *With the personal presence or action of the individual specified; in person.*
- *Concerning the speaker.*
- *From one's personal standpoint; subjectively rather than objectively.*
- *In a private rather than public or professional capacity.*
- *In the flesh; without involving anyone else.*
- *In a personal way.*

classified	Arranged in classes or categories. <i>The classified columns of the newspaper.</i>
cloistered	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A cloistered walkway.</i>
each	(used of count nouns) every one considered individually. <i>They received 10 each.</i>
<u>either</u>	After a negative statement used as an intensive meaning something like 'likewise' or 'also'.
individual	A single organism. <i>Boat trips for parties and individuals.</i>
<u>individuality</u>	Separate existence. <i>Anything but individuality anything but aloneness.</i>
individually	Apart from others. <i>Partnerships and individually owned firms.</i>

prejudiced	Being biased or having a belief or attitude formed beforehand. <i>A prejudiced judge.</i>
<u>privacy</u>	The condition of being concealed or hidden. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people's privacy.</i>

<u>private</u>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <i>Private education.</i>
purvey	Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc). <i>We didn't want to purvey gloom and doom.</i>
<u>purview</u>	The scope of the influence or concerns of something. <i>Such a case might be within the purview of the legislation.</i>
<u>respective</u>	Belonging or relating separately to each of two or more people or things. <i>They chatted about their respective childhoods.</i>
respectively	Separately or individually and in the order already mentioned (used when enumerating two or more items or facts that refer back to a previous statement). <i>They received sentences of one year and eight months respectively.</i>
<u>secluded</u>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A secluded romantic spot.</i>
<u>single</u>	Reduce a railway track to a single line. <i>The batter singled to left field.</i>
<u>sole</u>	Put a new sole on. <i>A big blister on each heel and sole.</i>
<u>subjective</u>	The subjective case. <i>A subjective judgment.</i>
subjectivity	The quality of being based on or influenced by personal feelings, tastes, or opinions. <i>The subjectivity of human perception.</i>
superego	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the superego elements present in paranoia.</i>
unshared	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer unshared independent accommodation.</i>
