### Definitions of "Personally" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “personally” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *As an individual rather than indirectly.*
- *As a person.*
- *As yourself.*
- *With the personal presence or action of the individual specified; in person.*
- *Concerning the speaker.*
- *From one's personal standpoint; subjectively rather than objectively.*
- *In a private rather than public or professional capacity.*
- *In the flesh; without involving anyone else.*
- *In a personal way.*



## Synonyms of "Personally" as an adverb (12 Words)

<b>as far as i am concerned</b>	To the same degree (often followed by `as.
<b>as i see it</b>	To the same degree (often followed by `as.
<b>for my part</b>	In part; in some degree; not wholly.
<b>in my book</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in my estimation</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in my opinion</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in my own opinion</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in my own view</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in my view</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in person</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>individually</b>	In a distinctive manner. <i>Dublin people dress more <b>individually</b> than people in London.</i>
<b>singly</b>	One at a time; separately or individually. <i>The fine points are treated <b>singly</b>.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Personally" as an adverb

- *He had spoken personally and emotionally.*
- *She stayed to thank O'Brien personally.*
- *I went there personally.*
- *Nothing had gone well personally or politically.*
- *Every pupil is known personally.*
- *Personally, I think he made a very sensible move.*
- *He never forgave his father, holding him personally responsible for this betrayal.*



## Associations of "Personally" (30 Words)

<b>biased</b>	Favoring one person or side over another. <i>A <b>biased</b> account of the trial.</i>
<b>classified</b>	Arranged in classes or categories. <i>The <b>classified</b> columns of the newspaper.</i>
<b>cloistered</b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A <b>cloistered</b> walkway.</i>
<b>each</b>	(used of count nouns) every one considered individually. <i>They received 10 <b>each</b>.</i>
<b><u>either</u></b>	After a negative statement used as an intensive meaning something like 'likewise' or 'also'.
<b>individual</b>	A single organism. <i>Boat trips for parties and <b>individuals</b>.</i>
<b><u>individuality</u></b>	Separate existence. <i>Anything but <b>individuality</b> anything but aloneness.</i>
<b>individually</b>	Apart from others. <i>Partnerships and <b>individually</b> owned firms.</i>
<b>innermost</b>	Being deepest within the self. <i>The <b>innermost</b> chamber.</i>
<b>isomorphous</b>	Having similar appearance but genetically different.
<b><u>lone</u></b>	Characterized by or preferring solitude. <i>The <b>lone</b> doctor in the entire county.</i>
<b>monopolization</b>	Domination (of a market or commodity) to the exclusion of others.
<b>opinion</b>	A personal belief or judgment that is not founded on proof or certainty. <i>His <b>opinions</b> appeared frequently on the editorial page.</i>
<b>ownership</b>	The relation of an owner to the thing possessed; possession with the right to transfer possession to others. <i>The rise in car <b>ownership</b>.</i>
<b>personal</b>	Of or arising from personality. <i>He has his <b>personal</b> bank account and she has hers.</i>
<b>perspective</b>	A way of regarding situations or topics etc. <i>The theory and practice of <b>perspective</b>.</i>
<b>prejudiced</b>	Being biased or having a belief or attitude formed beforehand. <i>A <b>prejudiced</b> judge.</i>
<b><u>privacy</u></b>	The condition of being concealed or hidden. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people's <b>privacy</b>.</i>

<b><u>private</u></b>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <i><b>Private</b> education.</i>
<b>purvey</b>	Spread or promote (an idea, view, etc). <i>We didn't want to <b>purvey</b> gloom and doom.</i>
<b><u>purview</u></b>	The scope of the influence or concerns of something. <i>Such a case might be within the <b>purview</b> of the legislation.</i>
<b><u>respective</u></b>	Belonging or relating separately to each of two or more people or things. <i>They chatted about their <b>respective</b> childhoods.</i>
<b>respectively</b>	Separately or individually and in the order already mentioned (used when enumerating two or more items or facts that refer back to a previous statement). <i>They received sentences of one year and eight months <b>respectively</b>.</i>
<b><u>secluded</u></b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b><u>single</u></b>	Reduce a railway track to a single line. <i>The batter <b>singled</b> to left field.</i>
<b><u>sole</u></b>	Put a new sole on. <i>A big blister on each heel and <b>sole</b>.</i>
<b><u>subjective</u></b>	The subjective case. <i>A <b>subjective</b> judgment.</i>
<b>subjectivity</b>	The quality of being based on or influenced by personal feelings, tastes, or opinions. <i>The <b>subjectivity</b> of human perception.</i>
<b>superego</b>	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience. <i>True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.</i>
<b>unshared</b>	Not shared. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer <b>unshared</b> independent accommodation.</i>
