Synonyms of "Pertains" as a verb (9 Words)

appertain	Be appropriate or applicable. <i>The answers generally appertain to improvements in standard of service.</i>
bear on	Behave in a certain manner.
come to	Come to pass arrive as in due course.
concern	Be on the mind of. <i>It is not necessary for us to concern ourselves with this point.</i>
have to do with	Have or possess, either in a concrete or an abstract sense.
refer	Make reference to. <i>Refer a patient to a specialist.</i>
relate	Have reference to; concern. <i>The new legislation related to corporate activities.</i>

touch	Have an effect upon. <i>She didn't touch her food all night.</i>
touch on	Consume.

according	In proportion or relation to. <i>The distribution of his property differed widely according as it was real or personal estate.</i>
affect	Have an effect on; make a difference to. <i>This new ruling affects your business.</i>
appertain	Relate to; concern. <i>The institutional arrangements which appertain under the system.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>One of the world's biggest food and personal products combines.</i>
comprise	Form or compose. <i>The country comprises twenty states.</i>
concern	A feeling of sympathy for someone or something. <i>Environmental concerns.</i>
connection	A relationship in which a person or thing is linked or associated with something else. <i>He soldered the connection.</i>
connote	Involve as a necessary condition of consequence; as in logic. <i>Spinsterhood connoted failure.</i>
contain	Be capable of holding or containing. <i>The record contains many old songs from the 1930s.</i>
correlate	Mutually related. <i>We should correlate general trends in public opinion with trends in the content of television news.</i>
correlated	Mutually related.
entail	The act of entailing property the creation of a fee tail from a fee simple. <i>What does this move entail.</i>

entangle	Twist together or entwine into a confusing mass. <i>They were suspicious of becoming entangled in a civil war.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>How am I going to exist without you.</i>
<u>implicate</u>	Bring into intimate and incriminating connection. <i>He is implicated in the scheme to defraud the government.</i>
<u>implicated</u>	Culpably involved. <i>An innocent person implicated by circumstances in a crime.</i>
<u>implicit</u>	Always to be found in; essentially connected with. <i>Implicit trust.</i>
include	Add as part of something else; put in as part of a set, group, or category. <i>The list includes the names of many famous writers.</i>
included	Enclosed in the same envelope or package. <i>The included check.</i>
incorporate	Include or contain; have as a component. <i>Add the cheeses and butter and process briefly to incorporate them.</i>
<u>indirectly</u>	In a way that is not directly caused by something; incidentally. <i>I heard of the damage indirectly.</i>
<u>involve</u>	Be or become occupied or engrossed in something. <i>The situation was rather involved.</i>
<u>involved</u>	Emotionally involved. <i>The involved muscles.</i>
linked	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<u>relate</u>	Be relevant to. <i>He was related to my mother.</i>
related	Belonging to the same family, group, or type; connected. <i>School related activities.</i>
relation	The way in which two or more people or groups feel about and behave towards each other. <i>The meetings helped cement Anglo American relations.</i>
socialize	Make (someone) behave in a way that is acceptable to their society. <i>The children must be properly socialized.</i>
<u>tangle</u>	Tangle or complicate. <i>A tangle of golden hair.</i>

tie

A strip of material worn round the collar and tied in a knot at the front with the ends hanging down typically forming part of a man's smart or formal outfit.
