- scanning** The act of scanning systematic examination of a prescribed region.
- scrutiny** A prolonged intense look.
*Every aspect of local government was placed under **scrutiny**.*
- study** A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual s study.
*Anthropology is the **study** of human beings.*
- studying** Reading carefully with intent to remember.

- *A quick perusal of the index to the book reveals an interesting fact.*
- *I continued my perusal of the instructions.*

article	The definite or indefinite article. <i>An article about middle aged executives.</i>
book	Register in a hotel booker. <i>His name is in all the record books.</i>
conscientious	Relating to a person's conscience. <i>Conscientious application to the work at hand.</i>
crabbed	Annoyed and irritable. <i>A crabbed unhappy middle age.</i>
description	The action of giving a spoken or written account. <i>People who had seen him were able to give a description.</i>
detailed	Developed or executed with care and in minute detail- John Buchan. <i>An exquisitely detailed carving.</i>
education	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>Education is a preparation for life.</i>
essay	A short piece of writing on a particular subject. <i>The infant had essayed a few wobbly steps.</i>
exact	(of a subject of study) permitting precise measurements as a basis for rigorously testable theories. <i>An exact replica two feet tall was constructed.</i>
foregoing	The things just mentioned or stated. <i>The foregoing analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
informational	Relating to or characterized by facts about something; providing information. <i>This article is for informational purposes only.</i>
learn	Find out learn or determine with certainty usually by making an inquiry or other effort. <i>I learned Sanskrit.</i>
literary	Of language associated with literary works or other formal writing having a marked style intended to create a particular emotional effect. <i>The great literary works of the nineteenth century.</i>
literature	The humanistic study of a body of literature. <i>Her place in literature is secure.</i>

mathematical	Relating to or having ability to think in or work with numbers. A mathematical whiz.
monograph	Write a monograph on treat in a monograph. Meissner first monographed the plant in 1826.
<u>narrate</u>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. The series is narrated by Richard Baker.
<u>novel</u>	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. The novels of Jane Austen.
pedagogy	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. Pedagogy is recognized as an important profession.
peruse	Examine carefully or at length. Laura perused a Caravaggio.
potboiler	A literary composition of poor quality that was written quickly to make money (to boil the pot).
read	Speak the written or printed matter that one is reading aloud. The King will read the proclamation at noon.
reading	The action or skill of reading. The teacher assigned new readings .
<u>recite</u>	Recite in elocution. She recited a poem.
<u>scholarly</u>	Having or showing knowledge, learning, or devotion to academic pursuits. A scholarly career.
storybook	A book containing a collection of stories (usually for children). It was a storybook finish to an illustrious career.
studying	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
<u>teacher</u>	A personified abstraction that teaches. Books were his teachers .
teaching	A doctrine that is taught. Good classroom teaching is seldom rewarded.
textbook	According to or characteristic of a casebook or textbook typical. A textbook example.
