**scan** A medical examination using a scanner.  
*You could see the tumor in the CAT **scan**.*

**scanning** The act of scanning systematic examination of a prescribed region.

**scrutiny** A prolonged intense look.  
*Every aspect of local government was placed under **scrutiny**.*

**study** A thing that is or deserves to be investigated the subject of an individual s study.

*Anthropology is the **study** of human beings.*

**studying** Reading carefully with intent to remember.

<a href="#">book</a>	Register in a hotel booker. <i>His name is in all the record <b>books</b>.</i>
<b>conscientious</b>	Relating to a person's conscience. <i><b>Conscientious</b> application to the work at hand.</i>
<b>crabbed</b>	Annoyed and irritable. <i>A <b>crabbed</b> unhappy middle age.</i>
<b>description</b>	The action of giving a spoken or written account. <i>People who had seen him were able to give a <b>description</b>.</i>
<b>detailed</b>	Developed or executed with care and in minute detail- John Buchan. <i>An exquisitely <b>detailed</b> carving.</i>
<b>education</b>	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i><b>Education</b> is a preparation for life.</i>
<b>essay</b>	A short piece of writing on a particular subject. <i>The infant had <b>essayed</b> a few wobbly steps.</i>
<a href="#">exact</a>	(of a subject of study) permitting precise measurements as a basis for rigorously testable theories. <i>An <b>exact</b> replica two feet tall was constructed.</i>
<a href="#">foregoing</a>	The things just mentioned or stated. <i>The <b>foregoing</b> analysis of the economic class structure.</i>
<b>informational</b>	Relating to or characterized by facts about something; providing information. <i>This article is for <b>informational</b> purposes only.</i>
<b>learn</b>	Find out learn or determine with certainty usually by making an inquiry or other effort. <i>I <b>learned</b> Sanskrit.</i>
<b>literary</b>	Of language associated with literary works or other formal writing having a marked style intended to create a particular emotional effect. <i>The great <b>literary</b> works of the nineteenth century.</i>
<b>literature</b>	The humanistic study of a body of literature. <i>Her place in <b>literature</b> is secure.</i>



<b>mathematical</b>	Relating to or having ability to think in or work with numbers. A <b>mathematical</b> whiz.
<b>monograph</b>	Write a monograph on treat in a monograph. Meissner first <b>monographed</b> the plant in 1826.
<b><u>narrate</u></b>	Narrate or give a detailed account of. The series is <b>narrated</b> by Richard Baker.
<b><u>novel</u></b>	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. The <b>novels</b> of Jane Austen.
<b>pedagogy</b>	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <b>Pedagogy</b> is recognized as an important profession.
<b>peruse</b>	Examine carefully or at length. Laura <b>perused</b> a Caravaggio.
<b>potboiler</b>	A literary composition of poor quality that was written quickly to make money (to boil the pot).
<b>read</b>	Speak the written or printed matter that one is reading aloud. The King will <b>read</b> the proclamation at noon.
<b>reading</b>	The action or skill of reading. The teacher assigned new <b>readings</b> .
<b><u>recite</u></b>	Recite in elocution. She <b>recited</b> a poem.
<b><u>scholarly</u></b>	Having or showing knowledge, learning, or devotion to academic pursuits. A <b>scholarly</b> career.
<b>storybook</b>	A book containing a collection of stories (usually for children). It was a <b>storybook</b> finish to an illustrious career.
<b>studying</b>	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
<b><u>teacher</u></b>	A personified abstraction that teaches. Books were his <b>teachers</b> .
<b>teaching</b>	A doctrine that is taught. Good classroom <b>teaching</b> is seldom rewarded.
<b>textbook</b>	According to or characteristic of a casebook or textbook typical. A <b>textbook</b> example.
