- *Be present and apparent throughout.*

Synonyms of "Pervade" as a verb (20 Words)

be diffused through	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
be disseminated through	Happen, occur, take place.
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to diffuse power without creating anarchy.</i>
diffuse through	Spread or diffuse through.
extend throughout	Expand the influence of.

fill	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>Fill the child with pride.</i>
filter through	Pass through.
flow through	Move along, of liquids.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
infuse	Let sit in a liquid to extract a flavor or to cleanse. <i>Some physiologists infuses sugar solutions into the veins of animals.</i>
interpenetrate	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. <i>Fibres of meaning interpenetrate every strand of sound.</i>
pass through	Cause to pass.
percolate through	Gain or regain energy.
perfuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The transplanted kidney is perfused at low pressure by retrograde flow.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. <i>The aroma of soup permeated the air.</i>
riddle	Explain a riddle. <i>Riddle me this then.</i>
run through	Progress by being changed.
spread through	Cause to become widely known.
suffuse	To become overspread as with a fluid, a colour, a gleam of light. <i>His whole frame suffused with a cold dew.</i>

Usage Examples of "Pervade" as a verb

- *The sense of crisis which pervaded Europe in the 1930s.*
- *A smell of stale cabbage pervaded the air.*

broaden Make broader.
*He has to **broaden** Labour's appeal to the whole community.*

diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>Gas is diffused into the bladder.</i>
diffusion	The action of spreading the light from a light source evenly to reduce glare and harsh shadows. <i>The diffusion of knowledge.</i>
dispersed	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.</i>
dispersion	The pattern of distribution of individuals within a habitat. <i>Some seeds rely on birds for dispersion.</i>
disseminate	Spread (something, especially information) widely. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
distributed	(of a computer system) spread over several machines, especially over a network. <i>The figures of syllogisms all have properly distributed middle terms.</i>
distributive	A distributive word. <i>Transport and distributive industries.</i>
filter	A filter tip. <i>Filters can be used in photography to reduce haze.</i>
growing	The process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The growing concern over ozone levels.</i>
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
immanent	Of a mental act performed entirely within the mind. <i>A cognition is an immanent act of mind.</i>
infiltrate	Gradually permeate or become a part of. <i>Computing has infiltrated most professions now.</i>
intersperse	Place at intervals in or among. <i>Intersperse exclamation marks in the text.</i>
invasive	Gradually intrusive without right or permission. <i>The sound of the piano was invasive.</i>
leach	Cause a liquid to leach or percolate. <i>Leach the soil.</i>

<u>omnipresent</u>	Widely or constantly encountered; widespread. <i>The omnipresent threat of natural disasters.</i>
percolate	Spread gradually through an area or group of people. <i>He put some coffee on to percolate.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Pass through. <i>The aroma of soup permeated the air.</i>
<u>pervasive</u>	(especially of an unwelcome influence or physical effect) spreading widely throughout an area or a group of people. <i>An error is pervasive if it is material to more than one conclusion.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. <i>The pervasiveness of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.</i>
proliferate	(of a cell, structure, or organism) reproduce rapidly. <i>Pizza parlors proliferate in this area.</i>
scattered	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>Scattered villages.</i>
<u>seep</u>	(of a liquid) flow or leak slowly through porous material or small holes. <i>Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.</i>
spread	The fact or process of spreading over an area. <i>Spread each slice thinly with mayonnaise.</i>
ubiquitous	Being present everywhere at once. <i>His ubiquitous influence was felt by all the family.</i>
ubiquity	The state of being everywhere at once (or seeming to be everywhere at once). <i>The growing ubiquity of advertising.</i>
<u>widespread</u>	Distributed over a considerable extent. <i>Widespread fear of nuclear war.</i>
