filter through	Pass through.
flow through	Move along, of liquids.
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
infuse	Let sit in a liquid to extract a flavor or to cleanse. Some physiologists infuse s sugar solutions into the veins of animals.
interpenetrate	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. Fibres of meaning interpenetrate every strand of sound.
pass through	Cause to pass.
percolate through	Gain or regain energy.
perfuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. The transplanted kidney is perfuse d at low pressure by retrograde flow.
<u>permeate</u>	Penetrate mutually or be interlocked. The aroma of soup permeate d the air.
riddle	Explain a riddle. <i>Riddle</i> me this then.
run through	Progress by being changed.
spread through	Cause to become widely known.
suffuse	To become overspread as with a fluid, a colour, a gleam of light. His whole frame suffuse d with a cold dew.

Usage Examples of "Pervade" as a verb

- The sense of crisis which pervaded Europe in the 1930s.
- A smell of stale cabbage pervaded the air.

Spread or diffuse through. Gas is diffuse d into the bladder.
The action of spreading the light from a light source evenly to reduce glare and harsh shadows. <i>The diffusion</i> of knowledge.
Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. Has ties with many widely dispersed friends.
The pattern of distribution of individuals within a habitat. Some seeds rely on birds for dispersion .
Spread (something, especially information) widely. There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.
The act of dispersing or diffusing something. The dissemination of public information.
(of a computer system) spread over several machines, especially over a network. The figures of syllogisms all have properly distributed middle terms.
A distributive word. Transport and distributive industries.
A filter tip. <i>Filter</i> s can be used in photography to reduce haze.
The process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The growing</i> concern over ozone levels.
Fill soak or imbue totally. His works are invariably imbue d with a sense of calm and serenity.
Of a mental act performed entirely within the mind. A cognition is an immanent act of mind.
Gradually permeate or become a part of. Computing has infiltrate d most professions now.
Place at intervals in or among. <i>Intersperse</i> exclamation marks in the text.
Gradually intrusive without right or permission. The sound of the piano was invasive .
Cause a liquid to leach or percolate. <i>Leach</i> the soil.



<u>omnipresent</u>	Widely or constantly encountered; widespread. The omnipresent threat of natural disasters.
percolate	Spread gradually through an area or group of people. <i>He put some coffee on to percolate.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Pass through. The aroma of soup permeate d the air.
<u>pervasive</u>	(especially of an unwelcome influence or physical effect) spreading widely throughout an area or a group of people. <i>An error is pervasive if it is material to more than one conclusion.</i>
pervasiveness	The quality of filling or spreading throughout. The pervasiveness of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.
proliferate	(of a cell, structure, or organism) reproduce rapidly. <i>Pizza parlors proliferate in this area.</i>
scattered	(of a person) distracted or disorganized. <i>Scattered</i> villages.
<u>seep</u>	(of a liquid) flow or leak slowly through porous material or small holes. Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.
spread	The fact or process of spreading over an area. Spread each slice thinly with mayonnaise.
ubiquitous	Being present everywhere at once. His ubiquitous influence was felt by all the family.
ubiquity	The state of being everywhere at once (or seeming to be everywhere at once. <i>The growing ubiquity of advertising.</i>
<u>widespread</u>	Distributed over a considerable extent. Widespread fear of nuclear war.
