An **irritating** child.



nettlesome Causing annoyance or difficulty.

Nettlesome paperwork.

pestering Causing irritation or annoyance.

Swarms of **pestering** gnats.

pestiferous Likely to spread and cause an epidemic disease- Jonathan Swift.

The **pestiferous** area around the prison.

plaguey Likely to spread and cause an epidemic disease.

Plaguey fevers.

plaguy Troublesome or annoying.

It was crazy to hope that good might come out of this **plaguy** mess.

Suffering from decay.

The supporting beams were **rotten**.

Intended to provoke or make fun of someone in a playful way.

Her lazy **teasing** smile.

Causing or tending to cause annoyance, frustration, or worry.

A frivolous or **vexatious** litigant.

vexing Causing irritation or annoyance.

It is **vexing** to have to admit you are wrong.

wretched Used to express anger or annoyance.

She disliked the **wretched** man intensely.





Usage Examples of "Pesky" as an adjective

Associations of "Pesky" (30 Words)

Annoy or exasperate.

Military action would only **aggravate** the situation.

Making a problem or offence worse or more serious.

aggravating

She found him thoroughly aggravating and unprofessional.

annoyance The feeling or state of being annoyed; irritation.

He turned his charm on Tara much to Hegarty s **annoyance**.

The act of troubling or annoying someone.

annoyingAnnoying habits.

Cause trouble or annoyance to (someone) by interrupting or otherwise

Causing annoyance or dissatisfaction; disagreeable.

It was not entirely **displeasing** to be the centre of such a drama.

galling Causing annoyance or resentment; annoying.

Found it **galling** to have to ask permission.

. To cause inconvenience or discomfort to.

inconvenience
The inconvenience of having to change trains.

Excite to an abnormal condition, or chafe or inflame.

Sprays and polishes can **irritate** dry sensitive skin.

irritating Causing irritation to a body part.

The substance may be **irritating** to eyes and skin.

A thing that annoys or irritates someone.

Much to my **irritation** Chris fell asleep.

mocking Playfully vexing (especially by ridicule)- Lawrence Durrell.

Her **mocking** smile.



nuisance

vex

(law) a broad legal concept including anything that disturbs the

reasonable use of your property or endangers life and health or is

offensive.

It s a **nuisance** having all those people clomping through the house.

objectionable Arousing distaste or opposition; unpleasant or offensive.

I find his theory **objectionable** in its racist undertones.

obnoxious Extremely unpleasant.
Obnoxious odours.

offend Hurt the feelings of.

Those activities which **offend** against public order and decency.

persiflage Light teasing.

An air of **persiflage**.

prickleA small spine or pointed outgrowth on the skin of certain animals.

The **prickle**s of the gorse bushes.

teasing

The act of removing tangles from you hair with a comb.

A **teasing** and persistent thought annoyed him.

Causing one to feel bored or annoyed.

The tiresome chirping of a cricket

troublesome Difficult to deal with.
