The driver didn t **bother** to ask why.

bugTap a telephone or telegraph wire to get information.

Is this hotel room **bug**ged.

chivvy Annoy continually or chronically.

An association which chivvies government into action.

harass Make repeated small-scale attacks on (an enemy.

This man **harass**es his female co workers.



hound Harass, persecute, or pursue relentlessly.

She was **hound**ed by the Italian press.

irk Irritate; annoy.

It **irk**s her to think of the runaround she received.

irritate Excite to an abnormal condition, or chafe or inflame.

Irritate the glands of a leaf.

keep after Maintain for use and service.

plagueCause continual trouble or distress to.
He has been **plague**d by ill health.

Tear into pieces.

I used to **tease** her about being so house proud.

trouble Take the trouble to do something concern oneself.

He was not **trouble**d by doubts.

afflict Cause great unhappiness for; distress.

Serious ills **afflict** the industry.

aggravate

Make (a problem, injury, or offence) worse or more serious.

Military action would only **aggravate** the situation.

Cause annovance in disturb especially by minor irritations.

annoying
Unsolicited calls are annoying.

A heavily built omnivorous nocturnal mammal of the weasel family, typically

beleaguer Annoy persistently.

blooming Informal intensifiers.

I didn t learn a **blooming** thing.

They caught the sailing **bug**.

Destroy the peace or tranquility of. disturb

Don t **disturb** the patient s wounds by moving him too rapidly.

Causing annoyance or resentment; annoying. galling

Found it **galling** to have to ask permission.

Annoy continually or chronically. harass

Harass the enemy.

Persistent, especially to the point of annoyance. importunate

An **importunate** job applicant.

A deliberately offensive act or something producing the effect of deliberate

insult disrespect.

He hurled **insult**s at us.

Irritate or vex. irk

It **irk**s her to think of the runaround she received.

Abnormally sensitive to a stimulus. irritable

She was tired and **irritable**.

Make (someone) annoyed or a little angry. irritate

It **irritate**s me that she never closes the door after she leaves.

Making fun of someone or something in a cruel way; derisive. mocking

Her **mocking** smile.

A person who nags someone.

nag Something **nag**ged at the back of his mind.

Sting with or as with nettles and cause a stinging pain or sensation. nettle

I was only asking Jess said **nettle**d.

Cause to feel resentment or indignation. offend

Her tactless remark offended me.

Cause to be annoyed, irritated, or resentful. peeve

Another **peeve** of mine is these so called reality shows.

Light teasing. persiflage

An air of **persiflage**.

Evoke or provoke to appear or occur. provoke

Her behavior **provoke**d a quarrel between the couple.

Play in ragtime.

rag Not a **rag** of clothing has arrived to us this winter.



rankle (of a comment or fact) cause continuing annoyance or resentment.

Lisa was **rankle**d by his assertion.

rile Cause annoyance in; disturb, especially by minor irritations.

He has been **rile**d by suggestions that his Arsenal future is in doubt.

tease Gently pull or comb (tangled wool, hair, etc.) into separate strands.

I used to **tease** her about being so house proud.

teasing Causing irritation or annoyance.

Her lazy **teasing** smile.

vex Angry; annoyed.

Thou shalt not **vex** a stranger.

vexation Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness.

The **vexation**s of life under canvas.
