- bantam** Very small.
- dainty** Affectedly dainty or refined.
A ***dainty*** appetite.
- delicate** Marked by great skill especially in meticulous technique.
His ***delicate*** ball playing skills.
- diminutive** Very small.
A ***diminutive*** figure dressed in black.
- elfin** Relating to or made or done by or as if by an elf.
Her black hair suited her ***elfin*** face.
- flyspeck** Very small.
The ***flyspeck*** nation of Bahrain moved toward democracy.
- lilliputian** Small and of little importance.
A ***lilliputian*** chest of drawers.

little	Small and of little importance. <i>I can't remember every little detail.</i>
slight	Small in degree; inconsiderable. <i>A slight romantic comedy.</i>
small	Have fine or very small constituent particles. <i>The small hill that sheltered the house.</i>
tiny	Very small. <i>A tiny hummingbird.</i>
