Intangibles like self confidence and responsibility.

An optical illusion in which atmospheric refraction by a layer of hot

<u>mirage</u> air distorts or inverts reflections of distant objects.

The surface of the road ahead rippled in the heat **mirage**s.

phantasmAn illusion, apparition, or ghost.

Every **phantasm** of a hope was quickly nullified.

phantasma Something existing in perception only.

shadowA dark patch or area on a surface.

He lived in the **shadow** of his father.

specter A mental representation of some haunting experience.

It aroused **specter**s from his past.

Something widely feared as a possible unpleasant or dangerous

spectre occurrence.

wraith

A dread of **spectre**s and witches affected every aspect of daily life.

Animation and energy in action or expression.

Spirit Spirits of turpentine.

The images seen on a television screen.

The runners emerged from the trees into his clear **vision**.

A ghost or ghostlike image of someone, especially one seen shortly

before or after their death.

A sea breeze was sending a grey **wraith** of smoke up the slopes.

Perceive what is not there; have illusions. hallucinate

Having no physical existence.

incorporeal A supreme but **incorporeal** being called God.

Having or exerting a malignant influence. malevolent

A gossipy **malevolent** old woman.

The courage to carry on. mettle

The team showed their true **mettle** in the second half.

(especially in ancient Egypt) a body of a human being or animal that

has been ceremonially preserved by removal of the internal organs,

treatment with natron and resin, and wrapping in bandages.

The **transcendental** importance of each person s soul.

transcendentalism Any system of philosophy emphasizing the intuitive and spiritual

above the empirical and material.
