actually	Used when expressing a contradictory or unexpected opinion or correcting someone. Large meteorites actually come from the asteroid belt.
be	Have the quality of being copula used with an adjective or a predicate noun. That was be fore the war.
casually	In an unconcerned manner. People who casually throw rubbish around the streets.
<u>coincidence</u>	The presence of ionizing particles or other objects in two or more detectors simultaneously, or of two or more signals simultaneously in a circuit. <i>He waited for the coincidence of the target and the cross hairs.</i>
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Occurring in the same period of time. Pythagoras was contemporaneous with Buddha.
<u>episode</u>	A passage containing distinct material or introducing a new subject. This change is followed by an episode in this new key.
event	A phenomenon located at a single point in space-time; the fundamental observational entity in relativity theory. <i>He repeated the success in the four lap 600 cc event.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. There exist ed no organization to cope with espionage.



hap	An accidental happening. He recorded all the little hap s and mis hap s of his life.
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. What is happen ing.
happening	Fashionable; trendy. A multimedia happening .
happenstance	Coincidence. It was just happenstance that I happened to be there.
inadvertently	Without knowledge or intention. His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.
<u>incidence</u>	The intersection of a line, or something moving in a straight line, such as a beam of light, with a surface. <i>The entire incidence falls on the workers.</i>
<u>incident</u>	A privilege, burden, or right attaching to an office, estate, or other holding. <i>One person was stabbed in the incident.</i>
incidental	An item that is incidental. The incidental catch of dolphins in the pursuit of tuna.
materialize	(of a ghost, spirit, or similar entity) appear in bodily form. He plays a teenager whose make believe friend materialize s.
misstep	An unintentional but embarrassing blunder. His campaign has been a farrago of misstep s and mixed messages.
occasion	Give occasion to. Sunday lunch has a suitable sense of occasion about it.
occur	Exist or be found to be present in a place or under a particular set of conditions. <i>Radon occurs naturally in rocks such as granite.</i>
occurrence	An event that happens. The occurrence or presence of life on other planets.
<u>output</u>	The quantity of something (as a commodity) that is created (usually within a given period of time. <i>The computer is outputting the data from the job I m running.</i>
recur	Go back to (something) in thought or speech. This is a recur ring story.
<u>recurring</u>	Occurring again periodically or repeatedly. Gratitude is a recurring theme in the book.



social	An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group. <i>Staff facilities included a social club and leisure complex.</i>
status	High rank or social standing. I noticed that there were some interesting status updates from some of my local friends.
<u>unintentionally</u>	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. Unintentionally rude sona lyrics.
