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Associations of "Phenomena" (30 Words)

accidental	Happening by chance or unexpectedly or unintentionally. <i>A verdict of accidental death.</i>
accidentally	Without intention; in an unintentional manner. <i>Accidentally knocked the vase over.</i>
activate	Put in motion or move to act. <i>Activate a metal.</i>
actually	Used when expressing a contradictory or unexpected opinion or correcting someone. <i>Large meteorites actually come from the asteroid belt.</i>
be	Have the quality of being copula used with an adjective or a predicate noun. <i>That was before the war.</i>
casually	In an unconcerned manner. <i>People who casually throw rubbish around the streets.</i>
<u>coincidence</u>	The presence of ionizing particles or other objects in two or more detectors simultaneously, or of two or more signals simultaneously in a circuit. <i>He waited for the coincidence of the target and the cross hairs.</i>
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Occurring in the same period of time. <i>Pythagoras was contemporaneous with Buddha.</i>
<u>episode</u>	A passage containing distinct material or introducing a new subject. <i>This change is followed by an episode in this new key.</i>
event	A phenomenon located at a single point in space-time; the fundamental observational entity in relativity theory. <i>He repeated the success in the four lap 600 cc event.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>There existed no organization to cope with espionage.</i>

hap	An accidental happening. <i>He recorded all the little haps and mishaps of his life.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>What is happening.</i>
happening	Fashionable; trendy. <i>A multimedia happening.</i>
happenstance	Coincidence. <i>It was just happenstance that I happened to be there.</i>
<u>inadvertently</u>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>His name had been inadvertently omitted from the list.</i>
<u>incidence</u>	The intersection of a line, or something moving in a straight line, such as a beam of light, with a surface. <i>The entire incidence falls on the workers.</i>
<u>incident</u>	A privilege, burden, or right attaching to an office, estate, or other holding. <i>One person was stabbed in the incident.</i>
incidental	An item that is incidental. <i>The incidental catch of dolphins in the pursuit of tuna.</i>
materialize	(of a ghost, spirit, or similar entity) appear in bodily form. <i>He plays a teenager whose make believe friend materializes.</i>
misstep	An unintentional but embarrassing blunder. <i>His campaign has been a farrago of missteps and mixed messages.</i>
occasion	Give occasion to. <i>Sunday lunch has a suitable sense of occasion about it.</i>
occur	Exist or be found to be present in a place or under a particular set of conditions. <i>Radon occurs naturally in rocks such as granite.</i>
<u>occurrence</u>	An event that happens. <i>The occurrence or presence of life on other planets.</i>
<u>output</u>	The quantity of something (as a commodity) that is created (usually within a given period of time). <i>The computer is outputting the data from the job I m running.</i>
recur	Go back to (something) in thought or speech. <i>This is a recurring story.</i>
<u>recurring</u>	Occurring again periodically or repeatedly. <i>Gratitude is a recurring theme in the book.</i>

- social** An informal social gathering especially one organized by the members of a particular club or group.

- status** High rank or social standing.
