<b>magnificent</b>	Very good; excellent. <i>She paid tribute to their <b>magnificent</b> efforts.</i>
<b>marvellous</b>	Extremely good or pleasing; splendid. <i>You have done a <b>marvellous</b> job.</i>
<b>miraculous</b>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our <b>miraculous</b> escape.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Owed as a debt. <i>An <b>outstanding</b> fact of our time is that nations poisoned by anti semitism proved less fortunate in regard to their own freedom.</i>
<b>remarkable</b>	Unusual or striking. <i>A <b>remarkable</b> coincidence.</i>
<b>sensational</b>	Causing intense interest, curiosity, or emotion. <i>A <b>sensational</b> murder trial.</i>
<b>singular</b>	Relating to or of the nature of singularity. <i>No explanation accompanied this rather <b>singular</b> statement.</i>
<b>staggering</b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>Suffered a <b>staggering</b> defeat.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Commanding attention. <i>Laid the poor fellow senseless with one <b>stunning</b> blow.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round.</i>

<b>eminent</b>	(of a positive quality) present to a notable degree. <i>An <b>eminent</b> peak.</i>
<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his <b>exceeding</b> kindness.</i>
<b>excellent</b>	Very good; of the highest quality. <i>Made an <b>excellent</b> speech.</i>
<b>exceptional</b>	Far beyond what is usual in magnitude or degree. <i>Late claims will only be accepted in <b>exceptional</b> circumstances.</i>
<b>extraordinary</b>	(of an official) specially employed in addition to the usual staff. <i>An <b>extraordinary</b> session of the Congress.</i>
<b>fabulous</b>	Extremely pleasing. <i><b>Fabulous</b> creatures.</i>
<b>fantastic</b>	Extravagantly fanciful in design, construction, appearance. <i>The film was <b>fantastic</b>.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Impossible to believe. <i>An almost <b>incredible</b> tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>
<b>magnificent</b>	Very good; excellent. <i><b>Magnificent</b> cathedrals.</i>
<b><u>marvelous</u></b>	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b><u>miraculous</u></b>	Remarkable and bringing very welcome consequences. <i>I felt amazed and grateful for our <b>miraculous</b> escape.</i>
<b>outstanding</b>	Clearly noticeable. <i>Works of <b>outstanding</b> banality.</i>
<b>preeminence</b>	High status importance owing to marked superiority.
<b>prodigious</b>	So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe. <i>The stove consumed a <b>prodigious</b> amount of fuel.</i>
<b>profound</b>	Profound quality. <i><b>Profound</b> crevasses.</i>
<b>regale</b>	Entertain or amuse (someone) with talk. <i>He was <b>regaled</b> with excellent home cooking.</i>
<b>remarkable</b>	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A <b>remarkable</b> sight.</i>
<b>splendid</b>	Excellent; very good. <i>His robes were <b>splendid</b>.</i>

<b>super</b>	A superintendent. <i>Another <b>super</b> skyscraper.</i>
<b>superb</b>	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g superb lyrebird. <i>A <b>superb</b> performance.</i>
<b>surpassing</b>	Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence. <i>A picture of <b>surpassing</b> beauty.</i>
<b>terrific</b>	Causing extreme terror. <i>Fought a <b>terrific</b> battle.</i>
<b>unparalleled</b>	Having no parallel or equal; exceptional. <i><b>Unparalleled</b> athletic ability.</i>
<b>vantage</b>	Place or situation affording some advantage especially a comprehensive view or commanding perspective. <i>The past is continuously reinterpreted from the <b>vantage</b> point of the present.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Inspiring delight, pleasure, or admiration; extremely good; marvellous. <i>They all think she's <b>wonderful</b>.</i>
