<b>inductive</b>	Possessing inductance. <i><b>Inductive</b> to the sin of Eve.</i>
<b>logic</b>	The system of operations performed by a computer that underlies the machine's representation of logical operations. <i>By the <b>logic</b> of war.</i>
<b><u>logical</u></b>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>A <b>logical</b> mind.</i>
<b>logician</b>	A person skilled at symbolic logic. <i>A leading mathematical <b>logician</b>.</i>
<b>mathematician</b>	An expert in or student of mathematics. <i>One of the world's foremost theoretical <b>mathematicians</b>.</i>
<b>philosophical</b>	Relating or devoted to the study of the fundamental nature of knowledge, reality, and existence. <i>He was <b>philosophical</b> about losing the contract.</i>
<b>philosophy</b>	A particular system of philosophical thought. <i>Self-indulgence was his only <b>philosophy</b>.</i>
<b>positivism</b>	A humanistic religious system founded on positivism.

<b>pragmatist</b>	An advocate of the approach that evaluates theories or beliefs in terms of the success of their practical application. <i>American <b>pragmatists</b> have influenced a great deal of recent philosophy of many types.</i>
<b><u>quibble</u></b>	Evade the truth of a point or question by raising irrelevant objections. <i>The only <b>quibble</b> about this book is the price.</i>
<b><u>scholar</u></b>	A university student holding a scholarship. <i>Mr Bell declares himself no <b>scholar</b>.</i>
<b>sinologist</b>	A student of Chinese history and language and culture.
<b>sociologist</b>	An expert in or student of the development, structure, and functioning of human society. <i>Historians and <b>sociologists</b> are still split on the matter.</i>
<b>sophism</b>	A deliberately invalid argument displaying ingenuity in reasoning in the hope of deceiving someone.
<b>sophist</b>	Any of a group of Greek philosophers and teachers in the 5th century BC who speculated on a wide range of subjects.
<b>sophistry</b>	A deliberately invalid argument displaying ingenuity in reasoning in the hope of deceiving someone. <i>Trying to argue that I had benefited in any way from the disaster was pure <b>sophistry</b>.</i>
<b><u>stoic</u></b>	A person who can endure pain or hardship without showing their feelings or complaining. <i>A <b>stoical</b> sufferer.</i>
<b>study</b>	Be a student follow a course of study be enrolled at an institute of learning. <i>She is in a deep <b>study</b>.</i>
<b>syllogism</b>	Deductive reasoning as distinct from induction. <i>This school of epistemology is highly advanced in <b>syllogism</b> and logical reasoning.</i>
<b>syllogistic</b>	Of or relating to or consisting of syllogism.
<b>theologian</b>	A person who engages or is an expert in theology.
<b>transcendentalism</b>	Any system of philosophy emphasizing the intuitive and spiritual above the empirical and material.
