- *A photo finish.*



## Synonyms of "Photo" as a noun (23 Words)

- bromide** A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper.

- enlargement** The action or state of enlarging or being enlarged.

- exposure** Abandoning without shelter or protection (as by leaving an infant out in the open.

- film** A thin sheet of (usually plastic and usually transparent) material used to wrap or cover things.

- frame** The hard structure bones and cartilages that provides a frame for the body of an animal.  
*An old bicycle **frame**.*
- image** A representation of the external form of a person or thing in art.

- likeness** Picture consisting of a graphic image of a person or thing.  
*The only known **likeness** of Dorothy as a young woman.*
- negative** A negative photographic image made on film or specially prepared glass from which positive prints may be made.  
*Photographs and **negatives** should be supplied for enlargement purposes.*

<b>photograph</b>	A representation of a person or scene in the form of a print or transparent slide or in digital format. <i>A <b>photograph</b> of her father.</i>
<b>pic</b>	A representation of a person or scene in the form of a print or transparent slide or in digital format. <i>A hard hitting action <b>pic</b>.</i>
<b>picture</b>	A photograph. <i>A full <b>picture</b> of the disaster had not yet emerged.</i>
<b>plate</b>	A main course of a meal served on one plate. <i>He underwent surgery to have a steel <b>plate</b> put into his leg.</i>
<b>portrait</b>	Any likeness of a person, in any medium. <i>The writer builds up a fascinating <b>portrait</b> of a community.</i>
<b>positive</b>	An adjective or adverb in the positive degree. <i>Try linking the signal input directly to <b>positive</b>.</i>
<b>print</b>	Fingerprints. <i>The <b>print</b> unions.</i>
<b>proof</b>	The strength of distilled alcoholic spirits relative to proof spirit taken as a standard of 100. <i>Spatial dimensions whose very existence is beyond all hope of <b>proof</b>.</i>
<b>shot</b>	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. <i>He trained at putting the <b>shot</b>.</i>
<b>slide</b>	A transparency mounted in a frame viewed with a slide projector. <i>The violinist was indulgent with his swoops and <b>slides</b>.</i>
<b>snap</b>	Tender green beans without strings that easily snap into sections. <i>The waistband had lost its <b>snap</b>.</i>
<b>snapshot</b>	A record of the contents of a storage location or data file at a given time. <i>My <b>snapshots</b> haven't been developed yet.</i>
<b>still</b>	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. <i>The <b>still</b> of the night.</i>
<b>study</b>	A room used for reading and writing and studying. <i>He perched on the edge of the bed a <b>study</b> in confusion and misery.</i>
<b>transparency</b>	A positive transparent photograph printed on transparent plastic or glass, able to be viewed using a slide projector. <i>The <b>transparency</b> of ice.</i>



## Associations of "Photo" (30 Words)

<b>album</b>	A collection of recordings issued as a single item on CD, record, or another medium. <i>The wedding pictures had pride of place in the family <b>album</b>.</i>
<b>artist</b>	A person whose creative work shows sensitivity and imagination. <i>Rip off <b>artists</b>.</i>
<b><u>camera</u></b>	Equipment for taking photographs (usually consisting of a lightproof box with a lens at one end and light-sensitive film at the other). <i>A video <b>camera</b>.</i>
<b>cameraman</b>	A photographer who operates a movie camera.
<b><u>characterization</u></b>	The act of describing distinctive characteristics or essential features. <i>She rejected that <b>characterization</b> of her film.</i>
<b>cinematic</b>	Having qualities characteristic of films. <i><b>Cinematic</b> output.</i>

<b>correspondent</b>	Someone who communicates by means of letters. <i>A cricket <b>correspondent</b>.</i>
<b>daguerreotype</b>	A photograph made by an early photographic process; the image was produced on a silver plate sensitized to iodine and developed in mercury vapor.
<b>digital</b>	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i>A <b>digital</b> recording.</i>
<b>enlarger</b>	An apparatus for enlarging or reducing negatives or positives.
<b>film</b>	Make a film or photograph of something. <i>His eyes had <b>filmed</b> over.</i>
<b>illustrator</b>	An artist who makes illustrations (for books or magazines or advertisements etc).
<b>journalist</b>	Someone who keeps a diary or journal. <i>Foreign <b>journalists</b> had been expelled from the area.</i>
<b>masterpiece</b>	An outstanding achievement. <i>A great literary <b>masterpiece</b>.</i>
<b>montage</b>	A sequence of film made using the technique of montage. <i><b>Montage</b> was a useful device for overcoming the drawbacks of silent film.</i>
<b>newspaper</b>	The organization responsible for producing a particular newspaper. <i>All the <b>newspapers</b> carried the story.</i>
<b>photograph</b>	Take a photograph of. <i>He was commissioned to <b>photograph</b> in the Crimea during the war.</i>
<b>photographer</b>	A person who takes photographs, especially as a job. <i>A freelance press <b>photographer</b>.</i>
<b>photography</b>	The process of producing images of objects on photosensitive surfaces.
<b>picture</b>	Show in or as in a picture. <i>He had no clear <b>picture</b> of himself or his world.</i>
<b>pixel</b>	The smallest discrete component of an image or picture on a CRT screen (usually a colored dot). <i>The greater the number of <b>pixels</b> per inch the greater the resolution.</i>
<b>portrait</b>	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>The photographer made excellent <b>portraits</b>.</i>
<b>portraiture</b>	The art of painting or taking portraits. <i>Ingres is a master of <b>portraiture</b>.</i>

<b>portrayal</b>	Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture. <i>A realistic <b>portrayal</b> of war.</i>
<b>projector</b>	An optical instrument that projects an enlarged image onto a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and <b>projector</b>.</i>
<b>reporter</b>	A person who reports, especially one employed to report news or conduct interviews for the press or broadcasting media.
<b>retouch</b>	Give retouches to hair. <i>This photograph has been <b>retouched</b>.</i>
<b>screen</b>	The data or images displayed on a computer screen. <i>His jeep was discreetly parked behind a <b>screen</b> of trees.</i>
<b>tripod</b>	The bronze altar at Delphi on which a priestess sat to utter oracles.
<b>video</b>	A video cassette. <i>The film will soon be released on <b>video</b>.</i>
