bromide	A reproduction or piece of typesetting on bromide paper. <i>Feel good bromides create the illusion of problem solving.</i>
enlargement	The action or state of enlarging or being enlarged. <i>Nine new stores and two major enlargements are planned.</i>
exposure	Abandoning without shelter or protection (as by leaving an infant out in the open). <i>They died from exposure.</i>
film	A thin sheet of (usually plastic and usually transparent) material used to wrap or cover things. <i>Film coverage of sporting events.</i>
<u>frame</u>	The hard structure bones and cartilages that provides a frame for the body of an animal. <i>An old bicycle frame.</i>
<u>image</u>	A representation of the external form of a person or thing in art. <i>Voyager 2 sent back images of the planet Neptune.</i>
likeness	Picture consisting of a graphic image of a person or thing. <i>The only known likeness of Dorothy as a young woman.</i>
negative	A negative photographic image made on film or specially prepared glass from which positive prints may be made. <i>Photographs and negatives should be supplied for enlargement purposes.</i>

photograph	A representation of a person or scene in the form of a print or transparent slide or in digital format. <i>A photograph of her father.</i>
pic	A representation of a person or scene in the form of a print or transparent slide or in digital format. <i>A hard hitting action pic.</i>
picture	A photograph. <i>A full picture of the disaster had not yet emerged.</i>
<u>plate</u>	A main course of a meal served on one plate. <i>He underwent surgery to have a steel plate put into his leg.</i>
<u>portrait</u>	Any likeness of a person, in any medium. <i>The writer builds up a fascinating portrait of a community.</i>
positive	An adjective or adverb in the positive degree. <i>Try linking the signal input directly to positive.</i>
print	Fingerprints. <i>The print unions.</i>
<u>proof</u>	The strength of distilled alcoholic spirits relative to proof spirit taken as a standard of 100. <i>Spatial dimensions whose very existence is beyond all hope of proof.</i>
shot	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. <i>He trained at putting the shot.</i>
<u>slide</u>	A transparency mounted in a frame viewed with a slide projector. <i>The violinist was indulgent with his swoops and slides.</i>
snap	Tender green beans without strings that easily snap into sections. <i>The waistband had lost its snap.</i>
<u>snapshot</u>	A record of the contents of a storage location or data file at a given time. <i>My snapshots haven't been developed yet.</i>
still	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. <i>The still of the night.</i>
study	A room used for reading and writing and studying. <i>He perched on the edge of the bed a study in confusion and misery.</i>
transparency	A positive transparent photograph printed on transparent plastic or glass, able to be viewed using a slide projector. <i>The transparency of ice.</i>

album	A collection of recordings issued as a single item on CD, record, or another medium. <i>The wedding pictures had pride of place in the family album.</i>
artist	A person whose creative work shows sensitivity and imagination. <i>Rip off artists.</i>
<u>camera</u>	Equipment for taking photographs (usually consisting of a lightproof box with a lens at one end and light-sensitive film at the other). <i>A video camera.</i>
cameraman	A photographer who operates a movie camera.
<u>characterization</u>	The act of describing distinctive characteristics or essential features. <i>She rejected that characterization of her film.</i>
cinematic	Having qualities characteristic of films. <i>Cinematic output.</i>

correspondent	Someone who communicates by means of letters. <i>A cricket correspondent.</i>
daguerreotype	A photograph made by an early photographic process; the image was produced on a silver plate sensitized to iodine and developed in mercury vapor.
<u>digital</u>	Relating to using or storing data or information in the form of digital signals. <i>A digital recording.</i>
enlarger	An apparatus for enlarging or reducing negatives or positives.
film	Make a film or photograph of something. <i>His eyes had filmed over.</i>
illustrator	An artist who makes illustrations (for books or magazines or advertisements etc).
journalist	Someone who keeps a diary or journal. <i>Foreign journalists had been expelled from the area.</i>
<u>masterpiece</u>	An outstanding achievement. <i>A great literary masterpiece.</i>
montage	A sequence of film made using the technique of montage. <i>Montage was a useful device for overcoming the drawbacks of silent film.</i>
newspaper	The organization responsible for producing a particular newspaper. <i>All the newspapers carried the story.</i>
photograph	Take a photograph of. <i>He was commissioned to photograph in the Crimea during the war.</i>
photographer	A person who takes photographs, especially as a job. <i>A freelance press photographer.</i>
photography	The process of producing images of objects on photosensitive surfaces.
picture	Show in or as in a picture. <i>He had no clear picture of himself or his world.</i>
pixel	The smallest discrete component of an image or picture on a CRT screen (usually a colored dot). <i>The greater the number of pixels per inch the greater the resolution.</i>
<u>portrait</u>	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>The photographer made excellent portraits.</i>
portraiture	The art of painting or taking portraits. <i>Ingres is a master of portraiture.</i>

portrayal	Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture. <i>A realistic portrayal of war.</i>
projector	An optical instrument that projects an enlarged image onto a screen. <i>He was a tobacco grower and projector.</i>
reporter	A person who reports, especially one employed to report news or conduct interviews for the press or broadcasting media.
retouch	Give retouches to hair. <i>This photograph has been retouched.</i>
<u>screen</u>	The data or images displayed on a computer screen. <i>His jeep was discreetly parked behind a screen of trees.</i>
tripod	The bronze altar at Delphi on which a priestess sat to utter oracles.
video	A video cassette. <i>The film will soon be released on video.</i>
