example	A representative form or pattern. There is an example on page 10.
fashion	A popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour. She fashion ed a tent out of a sheet and a few sticks.
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
illustration	Showing by example. By way of illustration I refer to the following case.
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. The lift stopped and he peered through the metal lattice .
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. A lifelike pose.



mannequin	A woman who wears clothes to display fashions. She was too fat to be a mannequin .
model	Construct a model of. He s been model ling for just two weeks.
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>He framed the problem within the psychoanalytic</i> paradigm .
paradigmatic	Of or relating to a grammatical paradigm. His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.
personality	Lively, engaging qualities. She had a sunny personality that was very engaging.
polymorphous	Occurring in several different forms or stages. A polymorphous organism.
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. <i>He is the prototype of good breeding.</i>
<u>replica</u>	A duplicate of an original artistic work. It is a replica of an antique plaque.
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. They shared these characteristics with other women in the sample .
<u>screening</u>	Refuse separated by sieving grain. The less than successful screening of the sitcom s pilot episode.
simulation	The act of giving a false appearance. <i>Simulation</i> of blood flowing through arteries and veins.
<u>specimen</u>	A bit of tissue or blood or urine that is taken for diagnostic purposes. Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female specimen .
spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a spheroid .
tripod	A stool, table, or cauldron resting on three legs.
type	Determine the type to which a person or their blood or tissue belongs. The word element contains five different type s of character.
typify	Embody the essential characteristics of or be a typical example of. The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. A winsome smile.
