advisory	Recommended but not compulsory. <i>The Commission acts in an advisory capacity.</i>
archetypal	Recurrent as a symbol or motif in literature, art, or mythology. <i>The archetypal country doctor.</i>
archetype	A very typical example of a certain person or thing. <i>Mythological archetypes of good and evil.</i>
buxom	(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves. <i>A generation ago buxom actresses were popular.</i>
camera	A device for recording visual images in the form of photographs, film, or video signals. <i>She faced the cameras.</i>
display	Attract attention by displaying some body part or posing of animals. <i>The palace used to display a series of tapestries.</i>
epitome	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>
example	A representative form or pattern. <i>There is an example on page 10.</i>
fashion	A popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour. <i>She fashioned a tent out of a sheet and a few sticks.</i>
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
illustration	Showing by example. <i>By way of illustration I refer to the following case.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>The lift stopped and he peered through the metal lattice.</i>
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>A lifelike pose.</i>

mannequin	A woman who wears clothes to display fashions. <i>She was too fat to be a mannequin.</i>
model	Construct a model of. <i>He s been modelling for just two weeks.</i>
paradigm	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>He framed the problem within the psychoanalytic paradigm.</i>
paradigmatic	Of or relating to a grammatical paradigm. <i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i>
personality	Lively, engaging qualities. <i>She had a sunny personality that was very engaging.</i>
polymorphous	Occurring in several different forms or stages. <i>A polymorphous organism.</i>
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. <i>He is the prototype of good breeding.</i>
replica	A duplicate of an original artistic work. <i>It is a replica of an antique plaque.</i>
sample	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. <i>They shared these characteristics with other women in the sample.</i>
screening	Refuse separated by sieving grain. <i>The less than successful screening of the sitcom s pilot episode.</i>
simulation	The act of giving a false appearance. <i>Simulation of blood flowing through arteries and veins.</i>
specimen	A bit of tissue or blood or urine that is taken for diagnostic purposes. <i>Carla could not help feeling a degree of reluctant admiration for this odd female specimen.</i>
spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. <i>It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a spheroid.</i>
tripod	A stool, table, or cauldron resting on three legs.
type	Determine the type to which a person or their blood or tissue belongs. <i>The word element contains five different types of character.</i>
typify	Embody the essential characteristics of or be a typical example of. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
