arousal	Mutual sexual fondling prior to sexual intercourse. <i>Sexual arousal in dreams is common.</i>
biochemical	A biochemical substance.
biologic	Relating to biology biological. <i>These natural biologics can be as potent as manufactured drugs.</i>
biology	The science that studies living organisms. <i>The biology of viruses.</i>
<u>body</u>	Build the bodywork of a motor vehicle. <i>The main body of the house was built in 1625.</i>

cadaver	A corpse. <i>The cadaver was intended for dissection.</i>
catalyze	Change by catalysis or cause to catalyze. Relating to cells.
cellular	<i>Any effective opposition to a totalitarian regime must be secretive and cellular.</i>
clinical	(of a disease or condition) causing observable and recognizable symptoms. <i>Clinical depression.</i>
corpse	The dead body of a human being. <i>He believed that fascism would revive the corpse of Europe.</i>
dissection	Detailed critical analysis or examination one part at a time (as of a literary work). <i>This dissection of modern relationships.</i>
ergonomic	Of or relating to ergonomics. <i>The ergonomic hazards of computer use.</i>
exercise	Do physical exercise. <i>There are exercises at the end of each book to check comprehension.</i>
fitness	Fitness to traverse the seas. <i>They had to prove their fitness for the position.</i>
function	A mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>Her liver is functioning normally.</i>
metabolic	Undergoing metamorphosis. <i>A metabolic disorder.</i>
microbiology	The branch of science that deals with microorganisms.
motivate	Cause (someone) to have interest in or enthusiasm for something. <i>He was primarily motivated by the desire for profit.</i>
pathology	The branch of medical science that studies the causes and nature and effects of diseases. <i>The pathology of Huntington s disease.</i>
pharmacology	The branch of medicine concerned with the uses, effects, and modes of action of drugs.
physically	In a manner relating to the body as opposed to the mind. <i>Cyberspace is a virtual place it does not physically exist.</i>

physiology	The branch of biology that deals with the normal functions of living organisms and their parts. <i>The physiology of the brain.</i>
stimulate	Encourage development of or increased activity in (a state or process). <i>The women are given fertility drugs to stimulate their ovaries.</i>
stimulation	The action of arousing interest, enthusiasm, or excitement. <i>The child needs plenty of stimulation as bored hands can make mischief.</i>
tendinous	Consisting of tendons or resembling a tendon. <i>The tendinous portion of the hamstring.</i>
tissue	Tissue paper. <i>A box of tissues.</i>
vivisection	The act of operating on living animals (especially in scientific research). <i>The vivisection of America s seamy underbelly.</i>
